Maintaining the filters is easy, too. The grease filter simply snaps out for washing. The char-coal filter can be reactivated when necessary by baking it in an oven.



Is there a way to find out the incidence of brucellosis in county? At the present time, the only method of determining the incidence of brucellosis in beef herds of a county is an esti-mate based on test run in the county by local veterinarians. What effect will "B" on jaw have on price of cattle

Brucellosis does not materially affect the carcass of cattle for the purpose of human food. However, price paid for branded cattle depends on competitive bidding, as they can be sold only for slaughter to plants maintaining municipal state, or federal meat inspection.






