### Roy Bradstreet Honored With Trip, Tour Of Washington DC

Roy Bradstreet was selected to go on the America Supports You-Texas, The Texas Panhandle Honor Flight on September 18th thru 20th 2012 to Washington DC. Ninety men and women veterans left Amarillo on September 18th with a cheering crowd and water cannon salutes from the Amarillo Fire Department shooting over the plane as they took off.

At the arrival at the Baltimore airport they were greeted with another water cannon salute from the Baltimore Fire Department. There were cheers, flags, and supporters there to meet and assist them with help getting on the buses.

While in Washington DC the Veterans visited, the World War II Memorial, The Two Jima Memorial, The Korean War Veterans Memorial, The Vietnam Veterans Memorial, The Tomb of the Unknowns Changing of the Guards, Arlington National Cemetery, The United States Navy Memorial, The United States Air

Force Memorial, The Lincoln Memorial, and the US Capital.

Roy Bradstreet was in the 30th Division, 120 Infantry, they were called The Old Hickory Division. Roy and his twin brother, Coy, joined the service together at 18 in May of 1944. They fought together in the same infantry and on the same gun until they were wounded the first time. Roy fought in the Battle of Normandy, The Battle of the Bulge, and the Battle of Bastogne, all in France and Germany. Roy and Coy both were wounded twice. Both received one Purple Heart and one Oak Leaf Cluster. Roy was wounded the last time and five Germans found him and saved his life.

Roy enjoyed the trip very much and it brought back lots of memories. Roy has a book coming out in the near future about some of his experiences. Channel 7 went on the trip with the Veterans and will be airing a program on the trip the last of October and on Veterans Day.

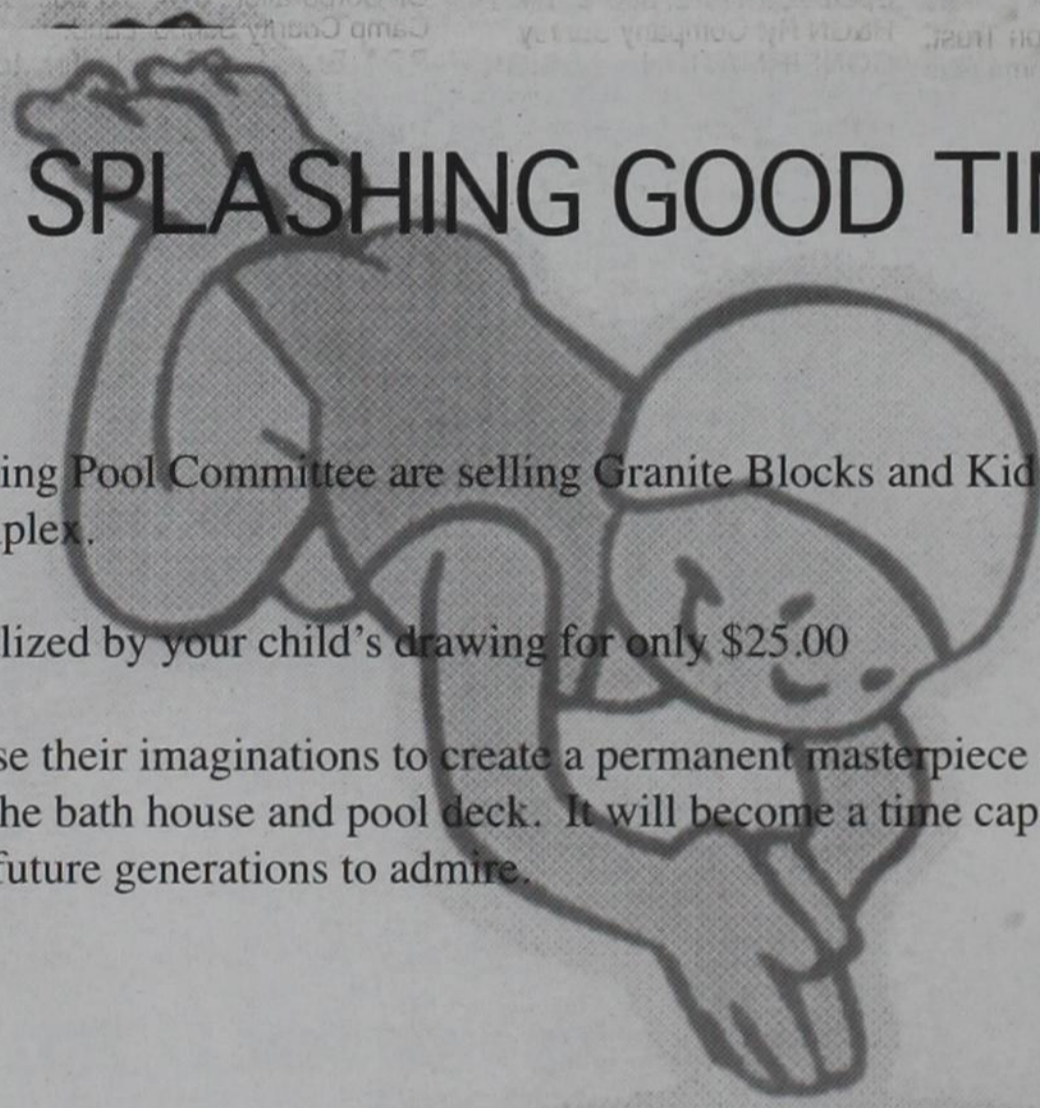

After another good kickoff coverage by the Mustangs to pin the Hornets inside the 20, they quickly answered. On the first play, Trent Morgan caught the bubble screen and goes 81 yards for the touchdown pass from Justin McDonald. Ruben Ruiz then puts the Hornets up by one with the extra point kick.

After the fast start, the defenses settled down and it became a defensive struggle for the rest of the first half. At the start of the second quarter, Wheeler made a great defensive stand, keeping the Hornets from getting a first down after having a third and one. They stuffed two run plays for no gain. Highland Park then returned the favor with 43 seconds left in the first half by stopping Wheeler on the 10-yard line on fourth and inches.

The second half started off with quick scores again. Eduardo Ramirez of Wheeler returned the opening kickoff 66 yards for a touchdown. Andrew Coomer would then receive a pass from Jake Ware for the 2-point conver-

sion. The Mustangs were back on top 14-7.

Highland Park quickly answered again, though. Lance Mullens caught a 58-yard pass from McDonald to get within one. Justin McDonald would then run in for the 2-point conversion after Wheeler received a penalty on the first attempt by the Hornets. The Hornets took the lead 15-14 and would not let it go.

The second half played out like the first with both offenses struggling. The final scores of the game were made by Highland Park's McDonald carrying the ball for a touchdown from seven yards out. Ruiz kicked the extra point for the final score of 22-14 in favor of the Hornets.

It was a tough loss for the Mustangs. The offensive line did show improvement with Andrew Coomer breaking the hundred yard mark rushing. He ended up with 119 yards on 20 carries.

Wheeler faces the Memphis Cyclones in game five at Memphis. It will be another test for the Mustangs. With the athletes learn-

ing to be up for it. Load up and head to Memphis Friday, the 28th, and support the players and coaches into a victory.

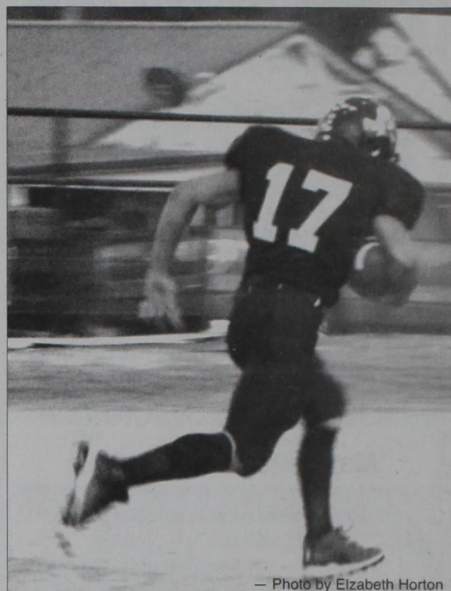
