## Signs Along Rural Roads

 To Be RegisteredMr. Lewis H. White, District
Engineer of the Childress District of
the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, announced
today that the owner of each offtoday that the owner of each off-
premise advertising sign which was premise advertising sign which was
erected before Sept. 1, 1985, along a road outside an incorporated city or town in Texas is required by recent
legislation to register the sign by legislation to register the sign by
December 30, 1985 or remove the December 30, 1985 or remove the
sign. The new law is known as House
Bill sign. The new law is known as House
Bill 1330 and refers to an off-premise sign as a sign which advertises a
service or product not principally sold on the premises where the sign is located. Mr. White stated that forms
are available in the Childress District are available in the Childress District
Office for use in registering a sign an Office for use in registering a sign an
that a form would be sent upon that a form would be sent upon
request. He also said that a $\$ 25$
nonrefundable fee is required with the nonrefundable fee is required with the
filing of the registration filing of the registration application.
Mr. White pointed out that there are only two exceptions to the State registration requirement. If the sign
was allowed under the Highway was allowed under the Highway
Beautification provisions of the Texas
Litter Absement Litter Abatement Act or if the sign is
in the extraterritorial jurisciction in the extraterritorial jurisdiction, the
sign does not have to be registered sign does not have to be registered
with the State. In enacting House Bill 1330, the
legislature also authorized the State legislature also authorized ue State
Department of Highways and Public Transportation to regulate on-premise
and off-premise signs which are and off-premise signs which are
erected after September 1, 1985. A permit for each sign is now required.
