What's Up Doc?

**INCOME TAXES** Question:

Doctor, with the high cost of income taxes, any relief I can find is helpful. Are there some costs of medical care that I may have overlooked at tax time?

Answer:

Almost all of your direct or indirect expenses for medical care are tax deductible. All of your direct expenses over 5% of your adjusted gross income are fully deductible. The usual items we consider include cost of medicines, hospital and physicians fees, and insurance premiums. Some items you may not have considered are also deductible. Special aids and supplies including artificial teeth, oxygen, dental supplies, modifications to your automobile that enable you to drive, and special amplifiers that allow those that are hard of hearing to use their telephones are also deductible.

Transportation costs to and from medical services are deductible at 9 cents per mile. If you must accompany a family member to a distant hospital and stay overnight, a lodging expense of \$50 each night is allowed. Any equipment that your doctor orders (i.e. Glucose monitoring devices for Diabetics) are allowable expenses.

Indeed, an accurate record keeping system and a keen eye for unusual expenses may pay big dividends at tax time. As with any tax questions you
