The Railroad Commission has allowed new gas rates for customers of Wheeler Gas, Inc. in the environs (unincorporated areas) surrounding Wheeler.

The new rates are identical to those established by the City of Wheeler for customers within the city's corporate

With the new environs rate changes an average monthly residential bill for nine Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas will increase by \$9.27. The change is effective today.

The Railroad Commission has the authority to approve rates for gas service in unincorporated areas of Texas. Proposed gas rates for these areas are examined in light of the company's operating efficiency and the rates that have been approved by the nearby city governments.

#### **End of Year Crop** & Livestock Reports The Texas Crop and Livestock

Reporting Service will begin contacting farmers and ranchers across the state in late November for final 1984 crop acreage, yield and production totals and during December for endof-year livestock and poultry inventory information.

The confidential interviews, conducted by mail or in person by field enumerators, provide information used by producers to make their production and marketing plans for the coming year.

'These surveys take on a new importance this year," State Statistician Dennis Findley added, "since the prolonged dry weather in many areas of the state cut crop and forage yields and forced heavy culling of livestock herds. Producers are depending on this imformation for an accurate picture of the 1984 agricultural situation. We all need a sound base to make the right decisions for 1985."

To reduce survey costs, the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service is urging farmers and ranchers to return the mailed questionnaires as soon as possible. The reported information will be combined for state as well as county estimates.

Annual county estimates are published for livestock, dairy, poultry. cotton, field crops, small grains, fruits and pecans, vegetables, and cost receipts from the sale of farm products.

## Water Biggest Issue Facing Texans

By Joel Brandenberger, Farm and Ranch Editor

Water has been described as the single biggest issue facing Texas during the remainder of this century. As one leading conservationist said, "We just can't grow anything without

sufficient water can be frightening. The Panhandle, for instance, once was dismissed as a barren wasteland, incapable of producing anything but scraggly cattle and dryland wheat of questionable yield.

Irrigation changed all that, and feet. what once was wasteland became fertile. Field after productive field now dots the region's countryside, alternating shades of amber, red and green with the change of seasons.

yon, has said his district, which covers all of the Panhandle and part of the South Plains, produces one-third of all Texas' agricultural output and onetenth of the nation's total output.

Water is the key, not just here, but across the state. That concern has led conservationists to try and estimate the life of Texas' water resources. One of the most comprehensive studiesperformed by the Texas Department importation of water. of Water Resources-paints a picture offers some hope.

A copy of the report obtained by the Globe-News at a recent meeting in Lubbock of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce indicates the state as a whole could see demand exceed supply soon after the turn of the century.

Demand in 1980 stood at 17.8 million acre-feet statewide while supply was 23.1 million acre feet. By 1990, demand is projected to range between 16.3 million acre feet (with increased conservation) to 19.7 million acre feet. Supply is expected to be 22.3 million acre feet.

By the year 2000, good conservation efforts could keep demand at 17.3 million acre feet while wanton use of water could see demand reach 25.4 million acre feet. Supply is expected to be at 25 million acre feet.

From there, the possibilities become more diverse. In 2010, the department expects damand to range from 19 million to 27.1 million acre feet; supply to level at 25.3 million acre feet. In 2020: demand between 20.4 million and 29.5 million acre feet, supply again at 25.3 million.

By 2030 — the last year of the study - demand could range from 22.2 million to 30.3 million acre feet, says water resources department principal planner Herb Grubb.

As always the principal users of water are the state's farmers and ranchers. Between 60 and 80 of the state's water demand is expected to come from agriculture, the study shows, with minimal demand from

[Editor's note: Article taken from 1980, all but about a thousand acre Amarillo Globe-News October 8, 1984] feet of the region's 7,830 acre-foot usage was consumed by agricultural interests. Supply barely exceeded demand that year, with available water sources totaling 7,971 acre feet.

> Grubb said the situation brightens briefly, then deteriorates quickly in study projections.

In 1990, demand is expected to Indeed, the image of Texas without range from 6,400 to 8,400 acre feet with supply at about 7,250 acre feet. By 2000, demand should range from 6,500 to 12,200 acre feet and supply should rest at 9,021 acre feet. In 2010, demand should be between 7,000 and 12,200 acre feet, supply at 8,490 acre

From there, things go downhill. In 2020, minimum demand is projected at 7,160 acre feet, higher than the projected supply of 6,879 acre feet. Maximum demand, at 12,660 acre State Sen. Bill Sarpalius, D-Can- feet, is far beyond the reach of expected supply.

By 2030, minimum demand is expected to be 7,623 to 11,541 acre feet, both well above the expected supply of 5,617 acre feet.

Conservationists have been and will continue to argue the best ways to meet the coming crisis. Grubb has ideas of his own that range between intense conservation and possible



The remaining 0.32 million acre-feet represents the dependable annual supply currently available to the Region from surface-water sources.

In the High Series projections, the High Plains and Trans-Pecos Region is projected to have a local area water shortage for irrigated agriculture of 1.17 million acre-feet annually before 1990, and this shortage is projected to increase thereafter. 
