HIGH FIBER DIET CONCERNS For years Americans paid little attention to the amount of fiber, or "roughage" in their diets. Then a study created an interest in the subject, and now "high-fiber" foods are being widely promoted as the

basis for healthful living. A high-fiber "diet plan" often recommends eating more raw foods. Since foods are made more digestible by prolonged cooking, it is sometimes assumed that canned fruits and vegetables are lower in fiber content than fresh foods.

Research sponsored by the National Food Processors Association assessed the fiber and pectin contents of ten vegetables, ten fruits, and eight fruit juices in frozen, canned and cooked form. The researchers found no evidence, however, that any of the food preparation methods produce substantial fiber loss.

The need to greatly increase the amount of fiber in our diets is questionable, since the results of research on high-fiber diets have been inconclusive.

Even if you want to increase the amount of fiber in your diet by a certain amount, that can be difficult because information on the exact amounts of fiber contained in particular food items is lacking.

The problem is that the term "Fiber" includes many compounds that resist digestion, but vary widely in chemical and physical characteristics.

Complete Matching set Gray Bathroom Fixtures Cellulose, hemicellulose, lignin, pectins and gums are amoung the compounds generally listed as classes of fiber. Each of these includes several different chemical materials.

Because almost no detailed information is available to serve as a guide for recommending either the quantity or type of fiber in the diet, moderation is probably best.

Simply eating a variety of whole grain products such as breads and cereals; raw and cooked fruits and vegetables; and nuts; will ensure a good mixture of fiber and contribute to the nutritional value of your diet.



The proposed tariff restructure will not result in any increases in the overall revenues of the Company. The proposed effective date for the tariffs is September 20, 1984. All customers and classes of customers will be affected by this filing.


The restructure in the basic long distance service (MTS) results in an overall decrease in the revenues received by the Company from such service of approximately \$100 million. While this proposed restructure results in an overall decrease in revenue, certain MTS rates are proposed to be increased to more nearly recover the access charges approved by the PUC for such service.

AT&T Communications has also filed restructured tariffs designed to more closely recover access costs for private line, DATAPHONE\* Digital Service (DDS), OCC facilities, WATS, 800 and directory assistance services. These restructured tariffs result in an approximate overall revenue increase of approximately \$100 million from increases in its WATS, 800, DDS, OCC facilities and private line rates, and institution of a charge for directory

The result of these proposed tariff changes and the restructure of our service offerings is to more nearly recover access costs from those services for which such access costs are incurred.

This proposed restructure results in no increase in overall revenue to AT&T Communications and is not a major rate change as that term is defined in Section 43(b) of the Public Utility Regulatory Act.

A complete copy of all tariffs and rate schedules is on file with the Texas Public Utility Commission at Austin, Texas. #### Phone: 806/826-5576 **Allison School** Tax Rate Hearing

A public hearing was held on August 20th by the Allison School Turstees to discuss a tax rate for fiscal year 1984-85.

The Board took action during the meeting through an unanimous approval of a resolution and ordinance calling for an ad valorem tax rate of \$0.2125 per \$100 valuation. Superintendent John Sollis explained "the increase in the tax rate was due to the lose of state funds except per capita money and the change in the educational makeup of the public school as outlined through House Bill 72 and House Bill 246." The tax rate during fiscal year 1983-84 was 0.175.

The ordinance setting the tax rate outlines the ad valorem tax discount schedule. Tax Collector, Louise Coulter says, "the School Board did not change the discount schedule, so every tax payer has a chance to decrease their own tax burden by following the discount schedule." The schedule is as follows: (1) 3% discount for taxes paid by October 31, 1984, (2) 2% discount for taxes paid by November 30, 1984, and (3) 1% discount for taxes paid by December 31, 1984. Sollis says that "the new tax rate should bring in the district --- if AISD has a 99% collection rate and a 21/2 discount factor --- net taxes of \$598,374.00.


