

A lift truck was rented for the removal of the damaged cap. The cap is to be replicated in the same material as was used in 1927, when the structure was erected. Materials used were clay, horse hair and news print. The damaged cap was taken to Amarillo where a copy will be made. Three welded points held the cap in place and all three were broken by the storm-apparently the column was twisted. County Commissioner Tommy Puryear holds a piece of the cap to show the size. The west side of the courthouse has been blocked off

because of the damage.
