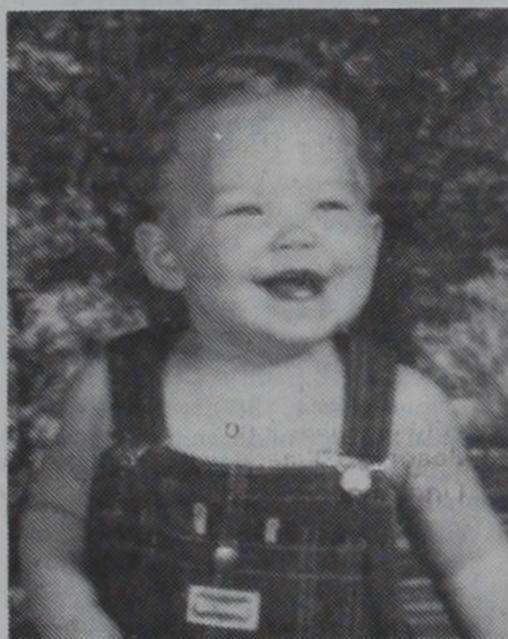
The teacher most remembered will be Mr. Meek because "he has made me so excited and he has been an integral part of my musical abilities. I owe him a lot for that."

Mrs. Bentley will be remembered because "she wasn't afraid to tell you

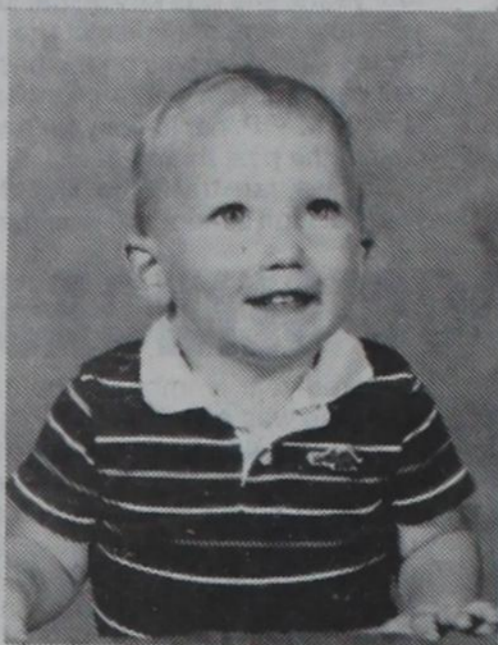


what she thought. If something was wrong, she was going to tell you about it. She was a good teacher."

She played basketball the first two years and tennis the same two years.

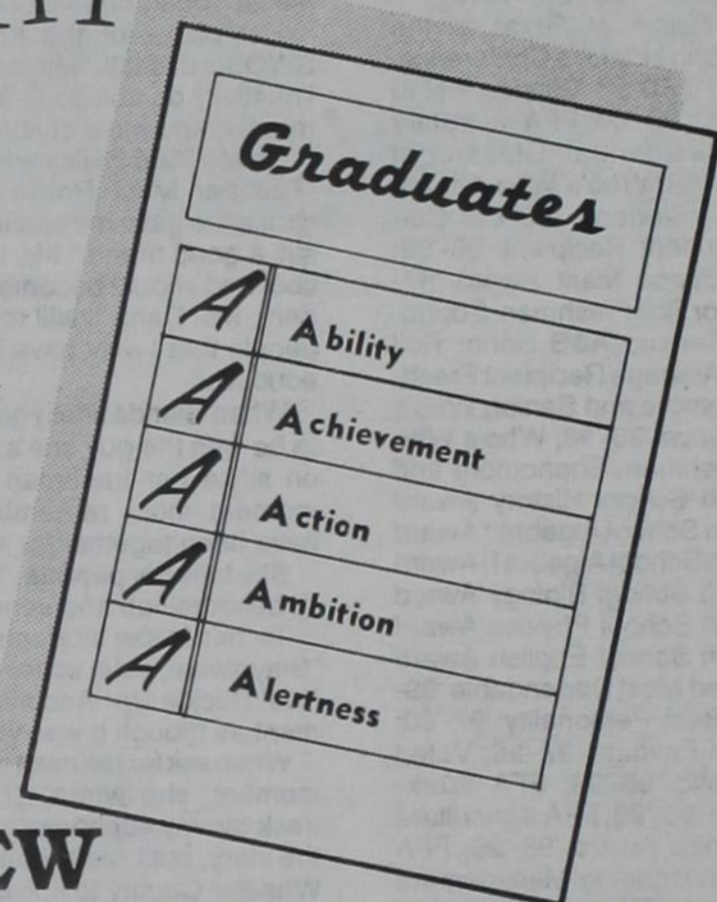

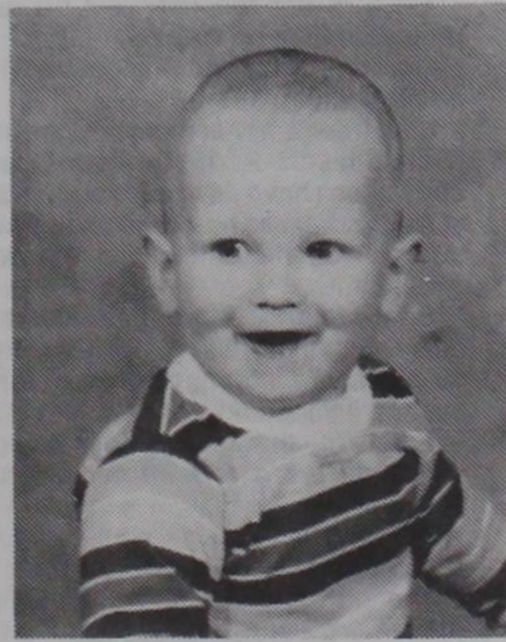

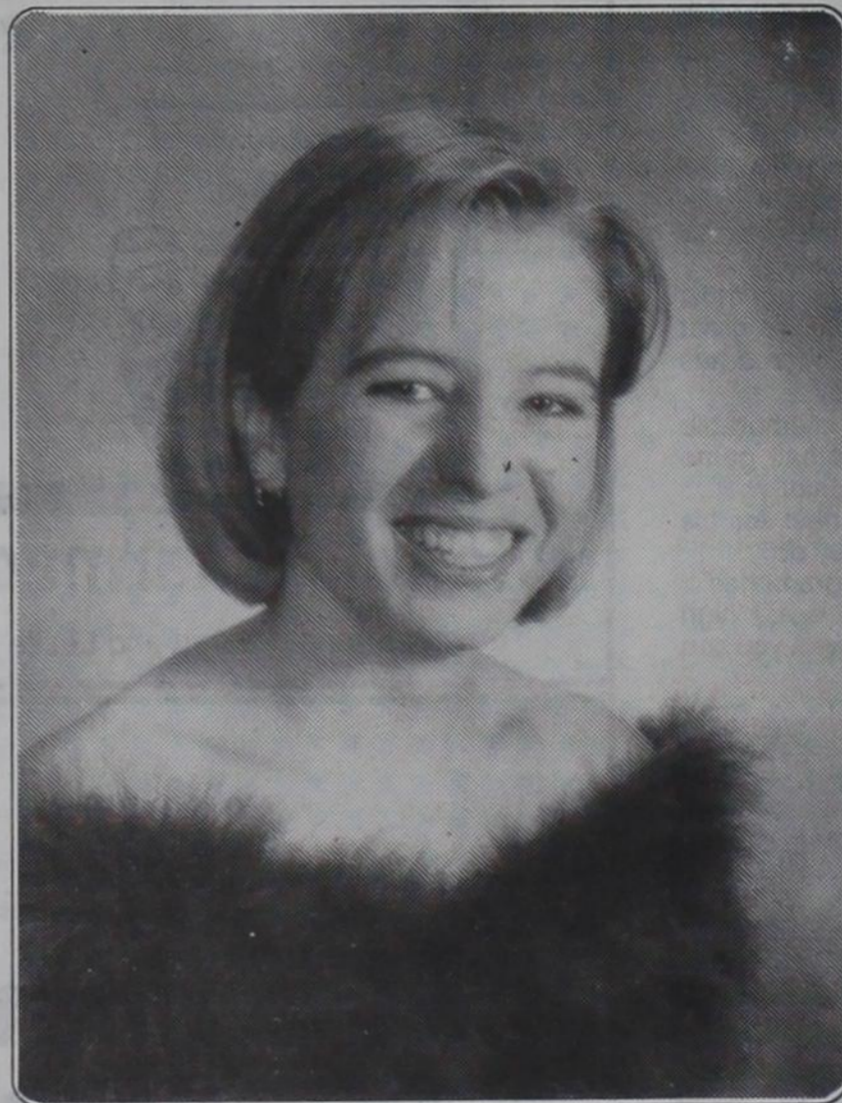


**Lorena Martinez**

College will be either at West Texas or Amarillo. She plans to major in public relations.

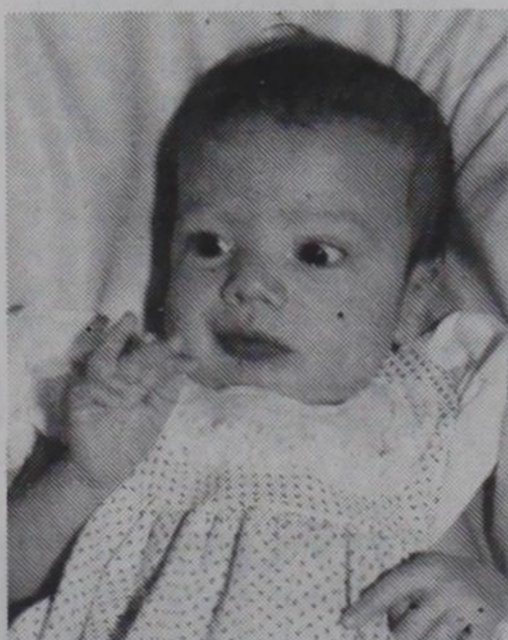


Whitney's teacher most remembered is Sammy Rives. "She made learning so much fun and never hesitated to help us," she wrote.

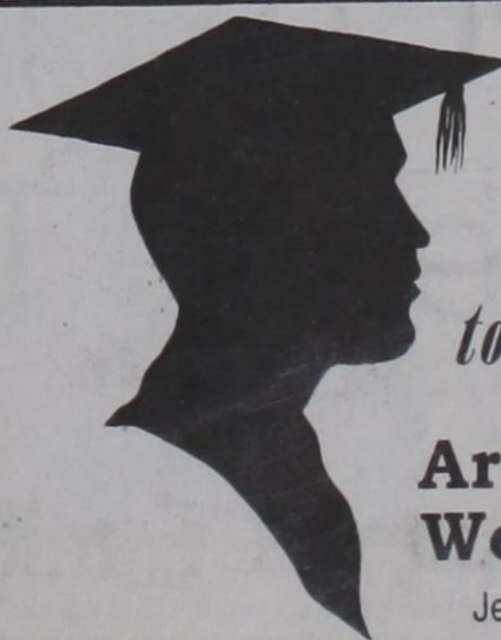

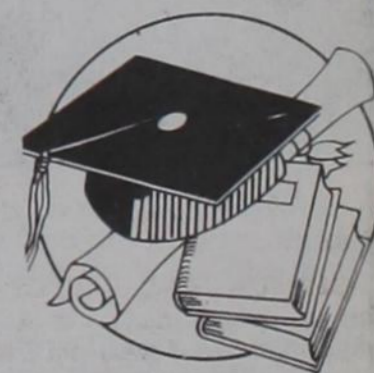

Financial Statements and Statistics: Financial Statements and Statistics were reported by Mr. Robertson. Dave Britt made motion that the Financial Statements and Statistics be accepted as presented. Bob Dukes seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Quality Improvement Minutes: The Quality Improvement Minutes of the meeting of May 3, 2000 were discussed and reviewed. Bob Dukes made motion to accept the minutes as presented. Dave Britt seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Administrator's Report: (1) Mr. Robertson gave an update on the Physician Recruitment. He stated that Dr. Wayne Porter from Corning, Arkansas, who had been to Wheeler with his family to meet with the Board, is showing interest in coming to Wheeler to establish a practice. It was suggested by the Board of Directors that Mr. Robertson follow up on this and visit with Dr. Porter for more information. (2) Mr. Robertson stated that the Chemistry analyzer in the Laboratory is now over 7 years old, and the expected life of these machines is usually 5 years. We are now experiencing difficulty in keeping the machine in operating order. The hospital had quotes from Infolab, Inc. for an Ortho Clinical Diagnostic Vitros 250 Chemistry Analyzer. This machine is one of the latest in Chemistry Analyzer machines, in that it would perform additional tests that our present machine will not perform that we are now having to send out to our reference laboratory. The Board instructed Mr. Robertson to check out the possibilities of obtaining this machine, either through lease or purchase. Also consider the maintenance agreement expense and report to the Board immediately as to the findings pertaining to this.

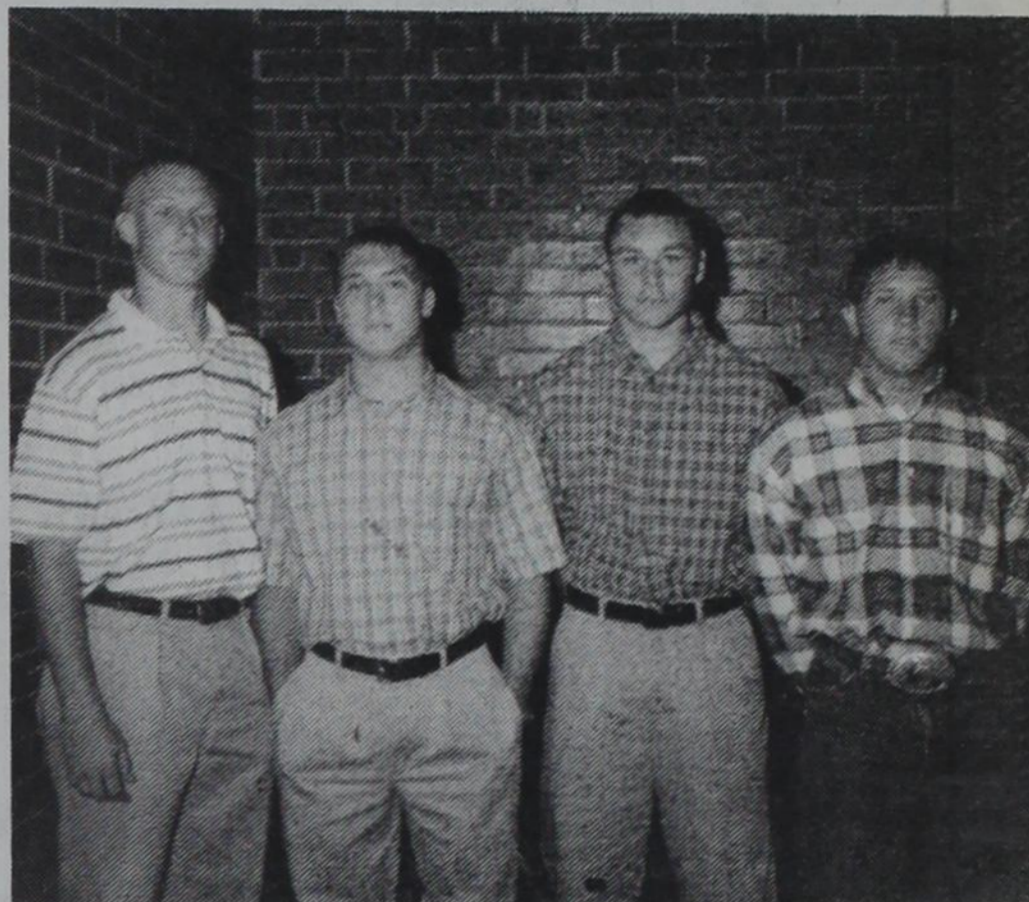
