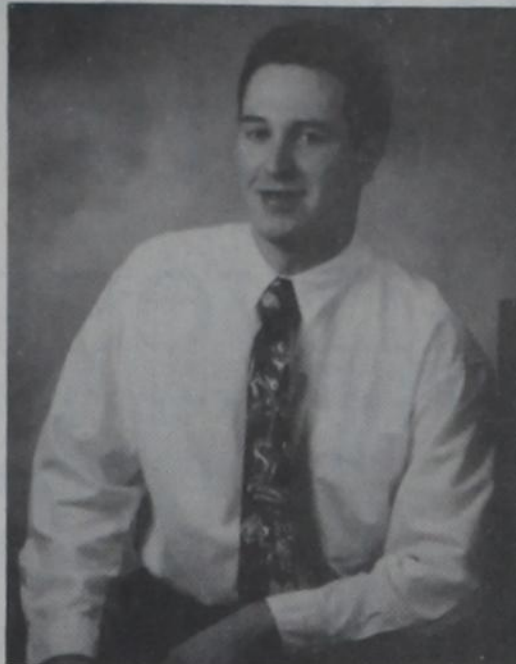
When he starts med school he is going to leave the business to his brother-in-law.

BREAK IS REPORTED IN THE SHOOTING OF ERIC SNOWDEN

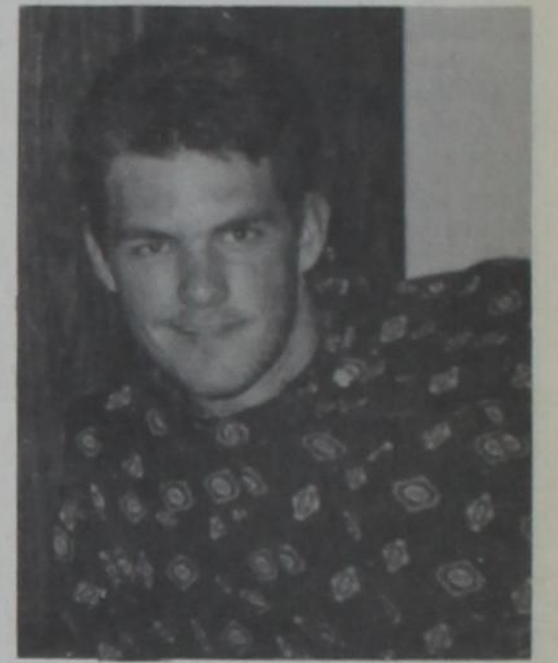
It has been learned by *The Wheeler Times* that the DeKalb County Police Department has a break in the case of the shooting of Eric Snowden in Stone Mountain, Georgia. The family learned Wednesday morning of the break in the case.

Eric was in Georgia working with his father, Mike Snowden, of San Antonio. He was using the telephone at a con-

venience store at about 1:20 a.m. on Thursday, December 15, when he was fatally shot by an unknown person or persons.

On two separate occasions, Eric has lived in Wheeler. He had attended Wheeler Schools his eighth and ninth grade years and again the first semester of his junior year before moving to San Antonio in 1992.

Eric was 19 years old at the time of his death. He was the son of Mike and Gay Snowden of San Antonio and the grandson of Louis and Joyce Martin of Wheeler.

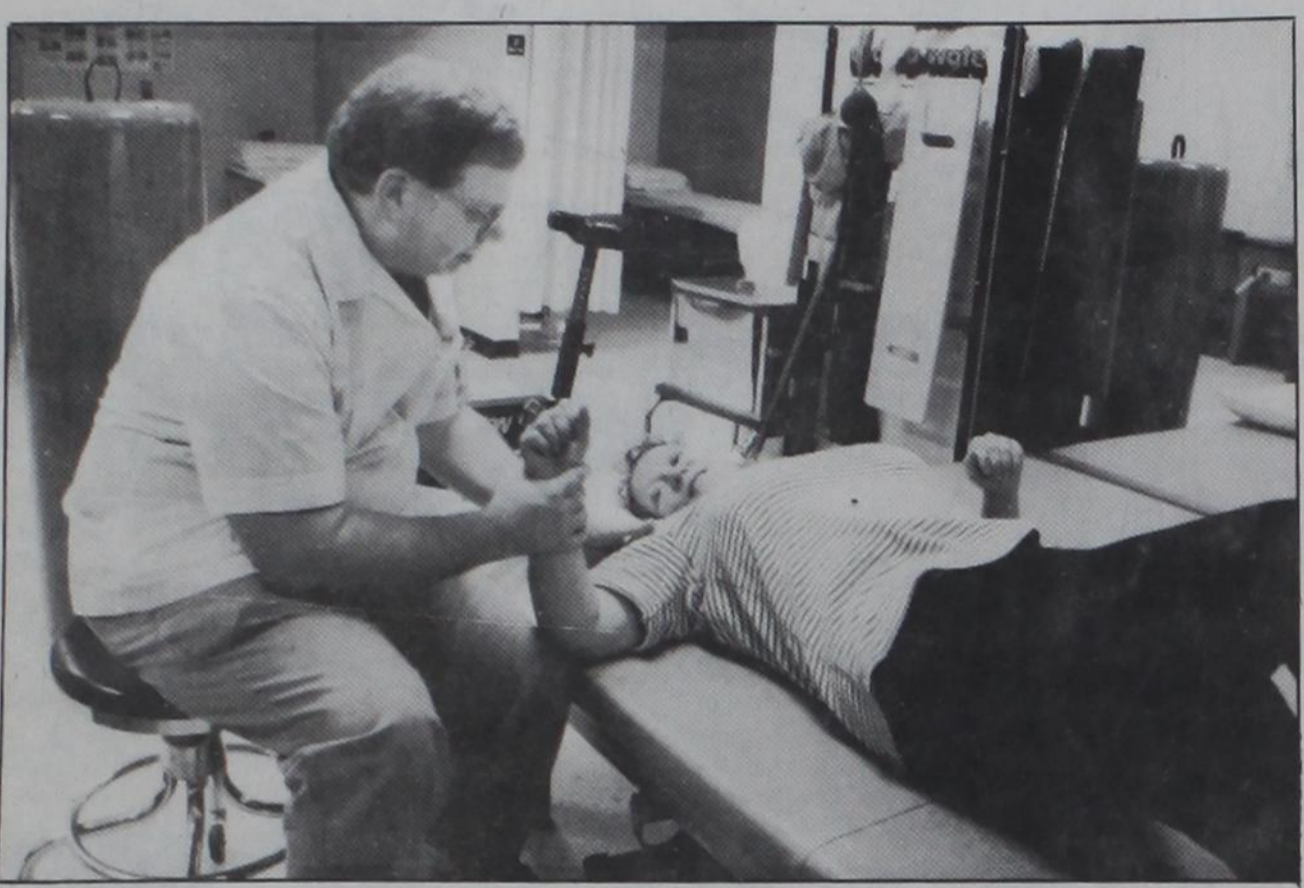
