

Allison Extends School Day

edition of the "Times".

Effective this coming school year, students in grades K-12 in the Allison Schools will attend classes for an additional 25 minutes per day.

The schedule change is the result of an opinion from the State Education Commissioner, Raymond Bynum, in responce to a request from Dallas Independent School District. All public school district in the state must operate

a seven hour day with six hours of instruction to all students in grade 4 or above. Exception to the above, kindergarten students must receive at least a 1/2 day program and students in grades 1-3 must receive a least a 61/4 hour program.

Classes for the Allison school will begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 3:30 p.m. All school buses will arrive at the school this year before 8:25 A.M. Kindergarten shall be operated on a 1/2 day beginning at 8:30 a.m. and ending at 12:00

Beginning with the 1983-1984 school year, the school will begin a computer literacy cource designed to famalize high school students in grades 11 and 12 with word processing and programing. The computer course will be conducted by Ms Carolyn White in conjunction with Business Educa-

Registration for students in grades 7-12 will be conducted by the school principal, Johnny McClellan, in his office on Friday, August 12.

Students will register at 1:00 P.M.; Students in grades K-6 will register at 8:30 a.m. on the first day of school on August 15. Students will need to report to their classroom

VOTERS TO DECIDE WATER DIST FATE

Wheeler county voters will go to the polls Saturday, August 13, to decide the fate of the Wheeler County Water Supply District. The election was called by the temporary board at a meeting Wednesday, July 20.

The notice of election, resolution calling for the election and the proposition appear on page 5 of

The creation of the water district will be the first step in Wheeler County retaining control of the waters of Wheeler county. The district will have no taxing authority; this ability to tax would come from projects proposed by the district and would have to be voted on by the voters.

The election for the Wheeler County Water Supply District resulted from the signing of Senate Bill 436. The bill was signed into law on April 26, 1983. The legistlation called for the appointing of a temporary board of directors for the district; one from each of the municipalities of the county and two from the county-at-large.

The temporary board took the "oath of office" with their first meeting Monday, June 13. M. Kent Sims and Dan Macina represent the county-at-large. Pete Burton, Woodrow Sims and Melvin May were appointed by the councils of Wheeler, Shamrock and Mobeetie respectively.
