





10:00 A.M. Monday, May 9th, 1983

Court was opened with a prayer by Clois Hanner. The Commissioner's Court met in Regular Session with the following members present: Elmer Harrison, Bill Atherton, Clois Hanner and Ernest Henderson, Commissioners precinct 1-2-3 & 4 respectively, with Wendell Morgan, County Judge presiding and T.J. Daughtry, County Clerk.

**MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS APPROVED:** Clois Hanner motioned, seconded by Ernest Henderson to approve the Court Minutes dated March 14th & 28th; April 11th & 25th, 1983, as submitted by the County Clerk. Motion Carried.

**BILLS APPROVED FOR PAYMENT:** Commissioner Harrison motioned, seconded by Commissioner Henderson to pay the bills submitted by the County Clerk, listed on The Minutes of Accounts Allowed, dated May 9th, 1983, beginning on Page 278 of Vol. 9. Motion Carried.

**WHEELER COUNTY APPRAISAL DIST. COMPUTER-NOTE PAID OFF:** Commissioner Harrison motioned, seconded by Commissioner Henderson to pay off the NCR Credit Corporation 60-month Purchase Plan lease #5116Y contract in the amount of approximately \$33,000 dollars representing the balance due on 1-9020 equipment. A unanimous vote was recorded.

**DISCUSSION ON WATER DISTRICT:** The Court decided to call a special meeting at 7:30 P.M., May 12th, 1983, inviting representatives from the various taxing entities to discuss the qualification of temporary directors.

**BIDS REJECTED ON AMBULANCE:** Two bids were received: C.R.S. Co., McAlester Oklahoma, \$23,089.40. Summers Ambulance, Duncanville, Texas, \$34,820.00. Elmer Harrison motioned, seconded by Bill Atherton to reject both bids and readvertise for bids. Motion carried. (Bids are on file with the County Clerk)

**FIRE CONTRACT-CITY OF MCLEAN:** Commissioner Hanner motioned, seconded by Commissioner Henderson to execute the following contract. Motion Carried.

**Fire Contract**  
The State of Texas  
County of Wheeler

THAT THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the City of McLean, Texas, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its Mayor and City Secretary, heretofore duly authorized, and Wheeler County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, acting by and through its County Judge and County Clerk heretofore fully authorized, it is hereby agreed as follows:

IT IS AGREED that recognized by the parties hereto that the City of McLean owns, operates and maintains a Fire Department for the purpose of fighting fires and furnishing fire protection and emergency services to said town. The City of McLean agrees to use its fire trucks and other fire fighting and emergency equipment to fight fires and furnish fire protection and other emergency services customarily performed by a fire department to the citizens of Wheeler County using as much of the equipment and keeping in the city as much of the equipment to fight a fire and service emergencies as might break out or occur therein, as good practices dictate.

WHEELER COUNTY AGREES to pay therefore the sum of \$125.00 for each trip of said Fire Department to the location of the fire, or to the location of the emergency occurring in Wheeler County, Texas.

be made for making any runs within the limits of Wheeler County, excepting the Cities of Shamrock and Wheeler, in good faith, regardless of whether there is a fire, an emergency, or other fire fighting equipment controlling the same.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED that the action of any person or persons while fighting fire or providing emergency services to the citizens of Wheeler County, shall be considered as the action of the agents of the County in all respects, except for gross negligence of malfeasance, notwithstanding such persons may be regular employees or firemen of said City.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the City of McLean shall not be held liable for the actions of any of the employees while engaged in fighting fires, or making emergency calls, outside of the city limits of McLean.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD that the City of McLean Fire Department will bill the railroad or company responsible for a fire, when that can be accurately determined. In the event said railroad or company does not pay said billing, then the City of McLean Fire Department shall bill Wheeler County as provided in this contract.


IT IS FURTHER AGREED THAT THIS CONTRACT SHALL COVER THE PERIOD OF TIME FROM 5-9-83, TO AND INCLUDING 5-8-84.

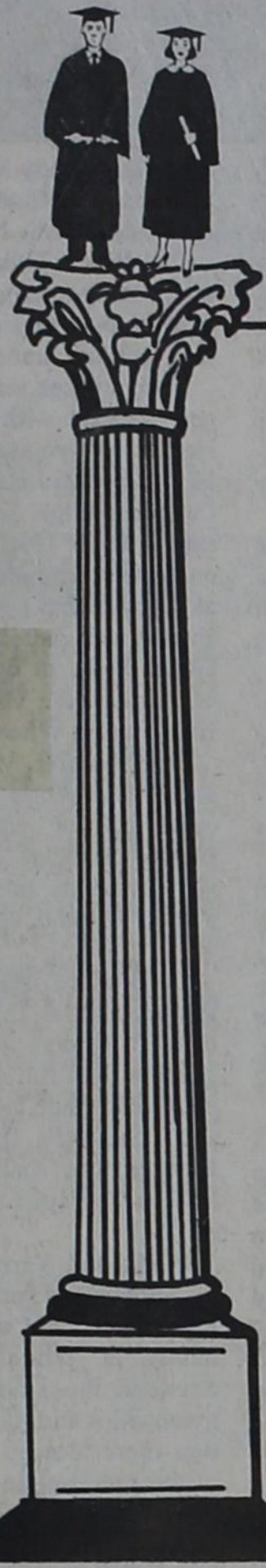

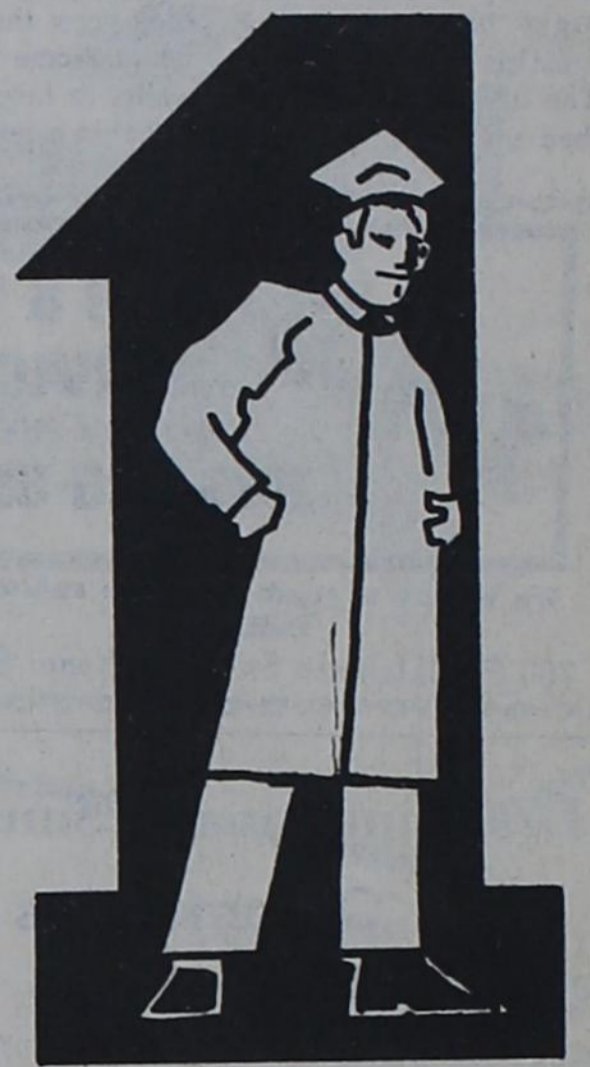

Special music, "The Greatest American Hero" was sung by members of the senior class under the direction of Mary Spradlin. Joe Woodward accompanied the group.

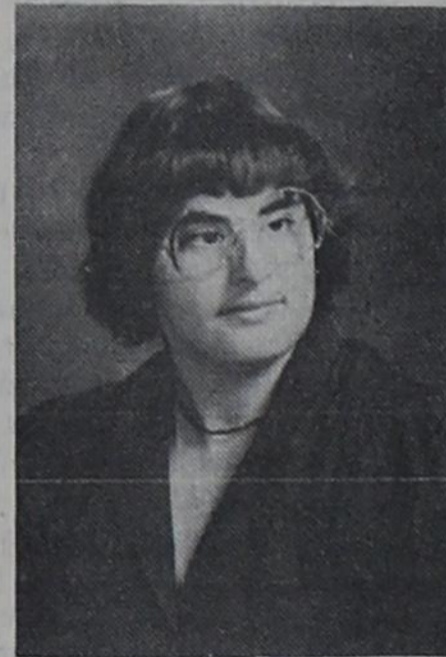
Lorraine Fiel presented the valedictorian address for the senior class and Kristi Hefley gave the eighth grade salutatorian address.
