Wrapping Round Gift **Need Not Frustrate**

There's no reason to lose your "cool" trying to wrap a round package for Christmas giving.

Place the package on paper and cut so there is an inch overlap on each side. Fix neatly with tape. Leave enough paper at both ends to fold over and meet in the center of the cylinder. Pleat these ends neatly toward the center, making firm creases. Cut two circles of paper to fit the ends and paste over the pleats.

Round packages may also be wrapped in several layers of tissue paper with overlap fixed with tape, and two or three inches of paper at each end. Tie the end wraps firmly with ribbon or yarn. Cut rosette-like ends that result in thin strips to resemble a party "snapper." Decorate each end with a



Shattuck Hosp. **Studies Cancer**

Newman Memorial Hospital in Shattuck, Oklahoma, is currently participating with the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation in a breast antigen-antibody study in women with breast problems. With the premission of their physician, women with benign breast disease, benign breast cysts, or breast cancer will be aksed if they wish to particapte in the study. Participants will then be asked for information concerning the history of breast disease problems in their family history and will also be asked to allow a blood test to be sent to the Founda-

tion for research. Recent studies by Drs. N.K. Day and R.A Good have shown that patients with breast cancer may have immune complexes circulating in their blood, which reacts against certain mammary tumor virus. This antibody is also present in bloods of family members where there is a high tendency to breast cancer. The purpose of this investigation, in which NMH is participating as a center, is to characterize the immune complexes and to study how these women's antigens or antibodies work against the mammary tumor virus. Such studies may permit early detection and more effective treatment of breast cancer.

Crime Rate Up **During Holidays**

Although it is "the season to be jolly", many area residents will find this holiday season to be less than jolly because of negligence and carelessness, according to Major C.W. Bell, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Three things are almost certain to be a part of the season: homes and apartments will be filled with gifts; families taking trips to be with loved ones and friends; and the crime rate skyrockets.

Major Bell offered the following suggestion as precautions you can and should take to avoid turning this joyous time into an unpleasant or tragic memory.

Start with your home. Make sure that you lock all doors and windows whether you are in the house or not. If you leave, don't leave a key outside in a great hiding place. Burglars, even amateurs, know all the usual and unusual hiding places.

We advise you not to make your affluence known. If you do put your Christmas tree in front of the picture window, be sure that the gifts are not easily visible from the outside. If your holiday plans include

a trip, have home deliveries discontinued and ask a trusted neighbor to look after your home. A collection of newspapers in the front yard is a beacon to burglars.

Plan a safe trip. Get plenty of rest the night before you leave. Allow plenty of time to get to your destination. It is much better to arrive late then not to arrive at all. Take a break in your driving every two hours or each 100 miles to avoid fatigue. Above all, do not mix alcohol and driving.

Be sure to lock the doors and remove the keys when you leave your automobile. Don't tempt thieves by leaving attractively wrapped packages on the seats or in plain view. Put gifts and luggage in the trunk, safely out of sight.

Robbery also increases during this season but these are avoid becoming a victim. Don't try to carry too many

Taking these simple precautions could make the difference betweeen tragedy and enjoyment this holiday season.

CANDLELIGHT If you want a candlelight

atmosphere for Christmas, don't deny yourself, but exercise proper caution with this potential fire hazard.

Never place lighted candles on the Christmas tree, or in the window. Do not use candles in any way with decorations that are flammable. Light candles only when someone is in the room and extinguish them when you leave the room or

Bell said, "All available DPS Troopers will be on patrol throughout the holiday period in an effort to reduce, both their presence and actions, violations that could lead to accidents. But it is only through the help and cooperation of the motoring public by their self-compliance that the needed reduction can be rea-

Major Bell stated, "Possibly the most prevalent accidents occuring this period will be the one car run-off-the roadway type accidents which is directly attributed to driver inatten-

The Major suggested that adequate travel time be budgeted in holiday plans, stop frequently and rest, reduce speed for road conditions, and above all, don't mix alcohol and driving.

"Feel free to request needed assistance from any DPS Trooper during your holiday travels. Let's all do our part to reduce to zero all holiday traffic deaths," Major Bell

Make a Noel Pennant to give ... or to keep

Most every neighborhood has a "boutique" . . . a special gift department or small shop that carries unusual and expensive gifts. As you wander through them you'll see many choice items that can be duplicated easily and less expensively at home. The Noel pennant illustrated is one of the many things you can put together. Directions for this unusual present are below!

NOEL PENNANT Supplies: Length of colored felt - 8" x 50" 10 inch wooden dowel Gold spray paint

2½ yards gold and white ribbon about 31/2 yards gold braid about 1/4 inch wide

Making sure that all the edges of the felt are straight and even, cut notched end of pennant by making a pencil mark 4 inches from one end and 4 inches from side edge. Draw diagonal lines from pencil mark to each corner. Cut along lines.

Each square on chart is 1 inch. The first letter starts 314 inches below top edge and is 11/2 inches from sides of pennant. Outline each letter with chalk following measurements on chart as guide. Allowing ½ inch for folding under the cut ends, cut a length of ribbon for each section of the first letter. Fold under 1/4 inch at both ends of each piece and glue; then glue ribbon in place, following chalk outlines. Continue this way until all letters have been glued onto pennant.

Starting across base of hem, glue the braid around edges of pennant. Spray dowel with gold paint. Fold hem over dowel when paint is dry and glue hem securely. Tie a length

Measure 2 inches down from top edge for hem.

SPECIAL GIFT FOR A CHILD - YOUR TIME

The most precious gift you can give a child this holiday season is part of yourselfyour time and interest reading to him.

With Christmas just around the corner, this is a good time for a trip to the library or book store to make book selections with that special youngester at your house.

Time spent in reading with a child can be a very meaningful experience for both parent and child. It also stimulates the child's language development.

Select books which are of interest to the child. They should be appropriate for the child's age and level of comprehension. Librarians and bookstore clerks can suggest suitable books.

When possible, let the child decide which book he wants to hear. For very young children with short attention spans, books should be brief with little dialogue and lots of pictures. As the child grows older. more complicated stories will interest him.

Set aside a few uninterrupted minutes at a regular time each day for reading with your child. Keep the atmosphere relaxed and enthusiastic. Let the child talk about what he sees and imagines is happening in the story.

Ask him questions about the story and listen to find out what he understands and remembers.

Remind him of experiences he has had of things he has seen which relate to the story.




