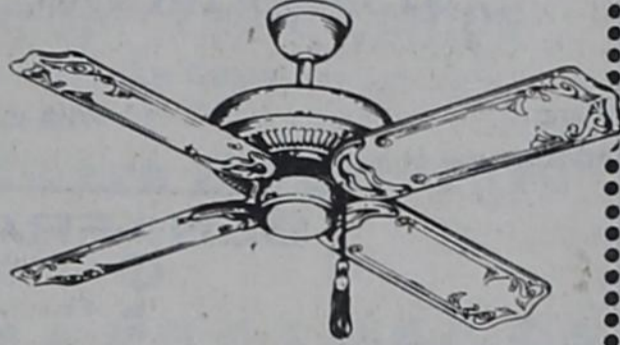

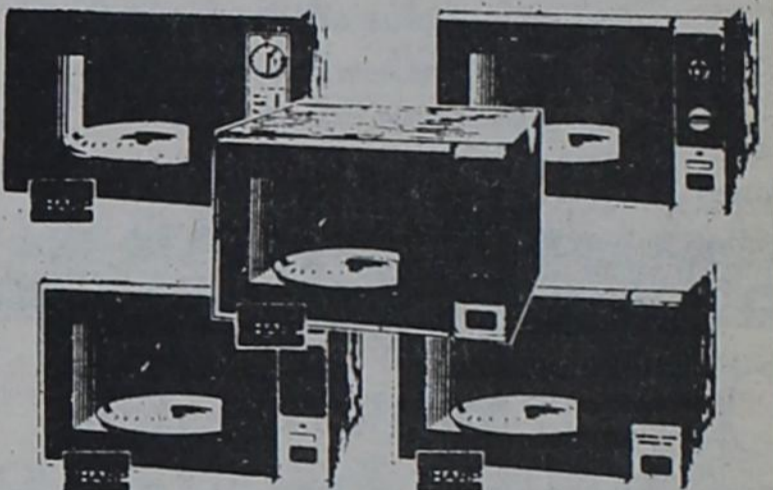

## WOOD STOVES — SOURCE OF WARMTH, DANGER

As the leaves start to fall and winter's cold chill draws closer by the day, many Americans are reminded—unpleasantly at that—of their large winter heating bills. As a result, more and more people have turned to alternate forms of heating, but the price paid for savings on fuel bills has been a dramatic increase in the number of residential fires, injuries and deaths.

One of the most popular home heating alternatives is the woodburning stove. Invented by Benjamin Franklin back in the mid-1700s, wood stoves were cited last year as a direct cause in more than 22,000 fires and 800 deaths. These figures are even more dramatic considering that fires and injuries caused by oil and gas heating units are steadily decreasing. In Oregon, for example, the state fire marshal's office reported that in 1981, 87 percent of all heating equipment fires were caused by woodburning stoves.

Despite the risks, scores of Americans are buying and installing woodburning stoves, primarily because they are effective in reducing heating bills. Per unit of heat, wood is less expensive than oil or gas. And unlike a standard fireplace, which tends to heat the air above the outside chimney, wood stoves are much more efficient in heating rooms where they're located.

**USING YOUR STOVE**  
If you have a woodburning stove, Mann emphasized that you should pay close attention to correct use. Never start a fire with flammable fluids like gasoline, kerosene or lighter fluid. Instead, put crumpled newspapers under kindling wood. Once that fire has started, larger logs can be placed in the stove.

"Even if people install them properly, wood stoves are still a fire hazard," Mann said. "Unsafe chimneys, inadequate clearances from combustible items, toxic gas back-ups, improper ventilation—all can cause fires and injuries." Most troubles involving wood stoves start in the chimney.

"Chimney fires are very common because most people don't keep their chimneys clean," he added. "The best thing to do when a chimney fire strikes is to call the fire department first, then close the stove's doors and the damper in the stove pipe. Never throw water on the stove, because that could cause the stove to crack and start a second fire," Mann explained.

Chimney fires start from a build up of creosote, a thick, black, sticky residue, which ignites by the heat of the fire. Creosote forms from partially burned combustible material, such as newspapers, trash or wood that's not properly seasoned. To avoid a dangerous buildup of creosote in your chimney, have it cleaned once a year. Mann also suggested it is wise to "burn your stove hot once a day, for a few minutes." But, don't make this the first fire of the day because a hot fire started in a cold stove could cause cracking.

Using the correct wood is another sensible practice that is often overlooked by the wood stove novice. Well seasoned hardwoods like ironwood, apple, red oak, sugar maple are the most heat efficient and least likely to produce creosote.

### Jerrie Moore To Chair Spelling Bee

Jerrie Moore, county treasurer of Wheeler County, has been named to serve as Wheeler County's Spelling Bee Director for 1983. He has been named director since 1979. The national Spelling Bee is sponsored nationally by the Scripps-Howard Newspapers and in the area by the Amarillo Globe-News and West Texas State University, Canyon.

Gene Parker, director of placement at the university, and bee coordinator, announces the continuation of the educational program for the 35th year for public and parochial school students.

Rules, established by the national sponsors, say that no student who will be older than 16 by June 1 of 1983, or in a grade higher than the eighth, will be allowed to enter, beginning at the classroom level.

Each director will set the date for his respective elimination event and report the winner (s) to the newspaper no later than April 9, 1983.

The district contest to be held in Amarillo on April 30, 1983, will include champs from a 45-county, four-state area. The Bee will be in the afternoon, beginning at 1:30 p.m. in the auditorium of Stephen F. Austin Junior High School, 1808 Wimberly.

In Amarillo all of the champs will be vying for a trip to Washington, D.C. for June, beginning on the 6th, plus other numerous gifts from the sponsors.

Once again the Amarillo

Globe-News is making available the study book, containing in excess of 3,000 words, plus 550 new ones over last year, is available to any principal, superintendent or contestant. The book is not available by mail in the City of Amarillo and the City of Canyon.

The 1981 and 1982 regional winners came from Clovis, N.M., representing Curry County. Jason Trobaugh competed in the national bee in 1981 and Chris Russell in 1982. Chris finished in 32nd place, among 112 national finalists.

The district sponsors also promote a Junior Bee for students in the sixth and lower grades. These county winners will be invited to Amarillo as guests of the sponsors on April 30 and will be given special recognition. It is not unusual for a Junior County winner to also claim the Senior County championship.

### HARD COLD FACTS

Americans will suffer through an estimated 70 million colds this year.

This means that we'll be missing work, falling behind in school and—worst of all—spending a lot of time just plain "miserable."

Contrary to popular belief, colds are caused by viruses—not by exposure to rain, cold or drafts—although these lower our resistance and make us more susceptible to viruses. By nature, viruses are highly contagious, and they're spread more rapidly in the fall and winter when people are in closer contact and spend more time indoors.

Here are some ideas to help you survive the cold season:

- Stay away from cold sufferers and from surfaces they have touched. If a member of your family is sick let him or her use disposable plates and utensils to prevent the spread of the infection.
- Don't allow the air in your home to become excessively dry. A humidity level of 35 to 40 percent will keep the mucus membranes of the nose and throat moist and thus serve more effectively in trapping germs before they can infect the body.

- If you do come down with a cold, follow the time-honored guidelines of staying in bed, drinking plenty of liquids, and taking medication to bring down your temperature. This will probably be more effective than any cold remedy you can buy. A study by the Food and Drug Administration reports that cold medicines may temporarily relieve the symptoms of a cold, but none can cure it or alter its course. Even Vitamin C has yet to be proved effective in preventing or curing colds.
- Be patient. A cold needs to run its 7-10 day course, and if you attempt to carry on with business as usual you will probably wear down your strength and prolong the infection. Be good to yourself and remain in bed for at least a day, covering with a warm blanket. By resting and relaxing, your body will have a chance to fight the cold without everyday stress.
