

Finally, be sure to label the tape, and store it in a special place -- for more recordings later and to make sure it won't be erased.







First 2,000 gal., \$30.00 (Min.) Over 2,000 gal., 2.00 per 1,000 gallons.

SECTION 2: That the rates and charges herein provided for the Waterworks System shall be effective July 1, 1982.

SECTION 3: That all ordinances, orders or resolutions, or parts thereof, heretofore passed and adopted by the City Council in conflict herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: That the public importance of this measure, and the fact that it is to the best interest of the City to revise rates and charges for the services rendered by the City's Waterworks System at the earliest possible date for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health safety and welfare of its inhabitants, constitute and create an em ergency and an urgent public necessity, requiring that this ordinance be passed and take effect as an emergency measure and this ordinance is accordingly passed as an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force immediately from and after its passage.

I could never send my child to a public school. The reason I couldn't is because children are a gift from God to parents. They don't belong to the government, and since they are from God, we parents are accountable to Him for their training. Every educational system is based on a philosophy of life--either Theistic or humanistic. In other words, every thing taught will either be taught from God's

point of view or from man's point of view. If it is taught from man's point of view, it will be distorted. God is Creator of all things; therefore, all subjects must be taught from the Biblical philosophy of life to be accurate and right.

Sometimes, I am misunderstood and consequently strongly criticized because of my outspokenness on this matter. I want to make it clear that I am not against the local precious people involved in public education. I am opposed to the humanistic system. It is a monster. Many people that teach in public schools don't like the humanism, but it is there and they can't

change it. However, I as an individual parent do not have to subject my children to it. I'm not responsible for other people's children and what happens to them (other than to preach and pray), but I am responsible for mine. Because of what I know about humanism, textbooks, God's requirements and the pliability of children, I cannot allow my children's minds to be captured by the world's system. (See Col. 2:8, Prov. 19:27, Prov. 22:6)

Secular, government school textbooks are designed around the humanistic philosophy of life. It is not neutral to Jesus Christ. It is opposite of Christianity. I will have more to say about humanism in next week's article. I have 2 cassette tapes on the subject of humanism taken from our radio broadcast recently. 
