And his will will remain the same no matter how many of us refuse to accept it. The Bible is still his word no matter how often we seek to destroy its effectiveness in our lives. In the final analysis, it will not matter what you say, or I say, or what a majority of men say on any given subject. What will matter and what will stand then is what God has said. God is a Majority!
