NOTICE **APRIL 30, 1982 DEADLINE**

Homestead Exemptions:

If you owned your home and used it as your principal residence on January 1, you may claim it as your residence homestead and receive a tax exemption.

If you are 65 years of age or older as of January 1, you are entitled to an additional exemption off the market value of vour residence homestead.

Certain disabled veterans or their survivors may be entitled to a partial exemption from property taxes. This exemption can be applied to any property that is owned on January 1.

"Open-Space Land"

Ag use 1-d-1

Open-space land is to be taxed at its productivity value instead of market value. This exemption is effective only if applications are filed with the appraisal district office.

Special Exemptions For Farmers

An exemption form will need to be filed with the farm equipment rendition.

Property owners will need to render both business and personal property.






