Larry Ray Harvey, 18, of Bonham, Texas, 3 indictments each for theft, burglary and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. At arraignment on November 23, Burpo and Harvey did not appear and their bonds were ordered revoked by Judge Grainger McIlhany. Coffey & Davis are waiting a trial date to be set.

Santa will be at the Rogue Theatre and make several visits in the local stores each Saturday, December 5-12-19 and Christmas Eve after 2:30.

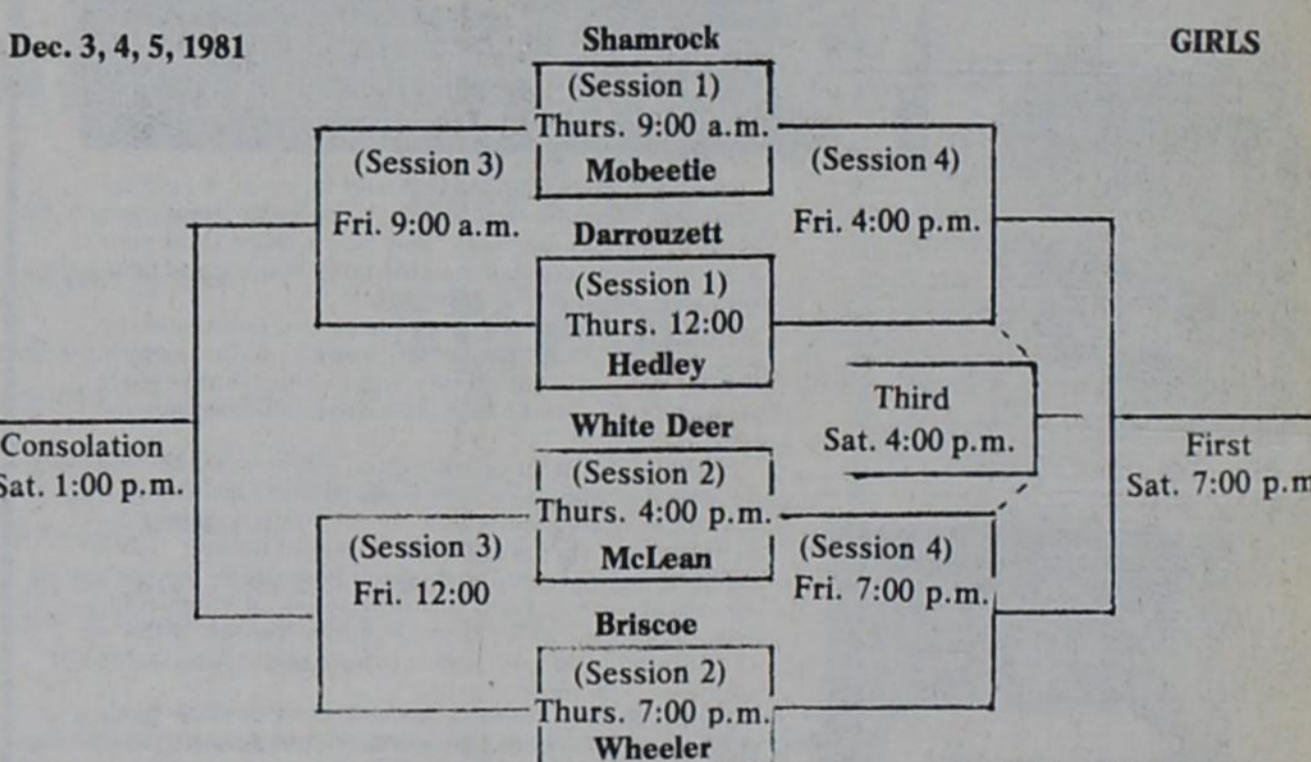
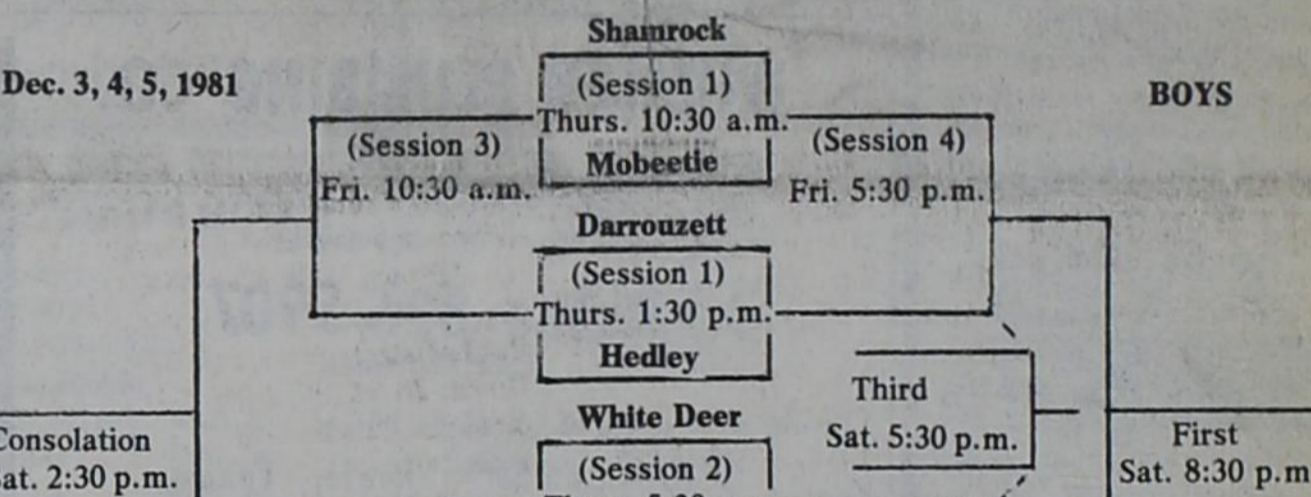

**Pioneer Gas Signs Agreement**

Pioneer Gas Products Company, a wholly owned subsidiary of Pioneer Corporation (NYSE), announced today that an agreement has been reached for settling government claims of overcharges for natural gas liquids.

The company has agreed to pay a total of \$14,907,000 plus interest from the effective date of the agreement, in 24 monthly installments. The agreement covers claims related to sales of liquefied petroleum gases, gas products, and condensate during a period from 1973 through the end of price controls in January 1981.

After considering federal income tax effects, the settlement will reduce earnings of Pioneer Corporation by 22 cents per share for the fourth quarter of 1981.

The Department of Energy gave formal notice in July 1980 of two claim totaling \$9,789,194, with interest, for a period from 1973 through 1977.

Company officials said the government had adopted an approach, through retroactive regulations and costing techniques different from those of the company, that would have resulted in a potential claim through the entire period of price controls greater than the settlement. The company admitted no violation of applicable laws and regulations.
