Days At Wheeler High Still In Musicians' Blood

Born in Alpine and raised in the Panhandle: even if he tried, Bret Mosley couldn't get Texas out of his blood.

"I think being from Texas has everything to do with the way I sound and the way I approach

things musically," he said. Mosley's debut,""Light & Blood," was released in December on Woodstock MusicWorks.

He knew what he wanted to create when he went into the studio. Mosley spent years tweaking and perfecting some of the songs on the record.

"I laid everything down live," he said. "I didn't punch in with overdubs; what you see is what you

Lyrics on the album are influenced by jargon and phrases dating to Mosley's days at Wheeler High. The soul of the album is based on his Texas heritage.

"I'm very proud of my Texas musical legacy and the spirit of the land there," he said. Born into a musical family, Mosley sang to his first audience at age 6 in a retirement home and began his love





Rocks, rocks, rocks. We are either blessed with them, buying them or dodging them and I will tell you why. I have never liked the walk from the patio to the Koi ponds, so we bought some rocks or maybe they would be more like flagstones at 12 cents a pound. Now paying for rocks seems kind of odd, for I used to go to the desert and get all I wanted for nothing California. Like I have stated before, there are no rocks out here in Allison. I would like to know what they did with all the rocks, for it seems as though rocks are everywhere in the USA. Anyway, we bought 602 pounds of rocks to build a walkway to the fish ponds. Now, that is not too bad, but the other rock problem is very bad. Seems like every time we go anywhere, we get a chip in the windshield from those flying trucks that shoot gravel at 80 miles an hour. Now Glenn Frosty Forrest is driving at about 70 mph so with the trucks going 80 that would mean that the gravel that is thrown from the truck tires has become a projectile flying at 150 mph...kind of like a bullet from a gun. The chip in the windshield can be big or small, but never the same shape. These roads out here in the country were never meant to carry large oil tanker trucks, but who's to stop them? They were still rounding up cattle with an ATV on the high-
