

WHY REAPPRAISE??

Appraisal Districts, by law, are required to equalize values on all properties within the Appraisal District. Real Estate and land values, because of inflation, differ greatly from year to year. Before, it was common practice to base property values on, for example, 1968 values in one part of the taxing district, and perhaps 1979 values in another part. Now, an across the state updating and standardization of values has been called for.

The homeowner, the landowner, and the businessman are entitled to equitable assessments. No one should be entirely free of tax responsibilities, but no one should be required to pay another person's share.

The law states that all properties must be assessed at 100%. Therefore, all assessment percentages are abolished. Since we are increasing the assessment percentages, we are compounding these inequities even more. The logical method to eliminate inequities and tax injustice is with a complete reappraisal program.
