## LIFEPAK 5 FUND IS GROWING HELP SAVE A HEART!

The North Wheeler County Volunteer Ambulance service is accepting donations for the purchase of Lifepak 5, a portable piece of equipment for use in the treatment of those patients suffering from heart problems. In the case of heart and trauma patients, the heart can be monitored from the time the ambulance arrives at the scene of the incident until the patient arrives at the hospital, and in the case of complete heart failure, Lifepak 5 will provide the electrical shock which may result in the saving of the patient's life.

In 1979 with the completion of the training of seven paramedics in the county, the commissioners approved the purchase of two Lifepak 5's—one for each of the two ambulance services; these have been in continuous use since installation in the ambulances. The local ambulance answered 176 calls in 1980 with sixty of those patients requiring the use of the Lifepak 5.

Both Wheeler and Shamrock have an ambulance equipped with Lifepak 5 and a third ambulance (without Lifepak 5) which was used as a "backup" when either of the ambulances made a transfer. The commissioners recognized the need for a fourth ambulance after several double transfers left the county with only one ambulance; a new ambulance was purchased in October and placed in Wheeler.

The North Wheeler County Volunteer Ambulance crew would appreciate your cooperation in purchasing a second Lifepak 5 for Wheeler.

An effort is made to always leave the Lifepak 5 in Wheeler if it is not needed in transfer, but the case may arise when the equipment is needed in two places at the same time. (Both ambulances were in service Monday, but neither needed Lifepak).

Lifepak 5 will cost in the neighborhood of \$6500. '54 Study Club has kicked off the drive with their donation. Again, these donations are tax deductible.

The fund raising drive is well underway by the Wheeler Vol. Amb. Ser. to raise money for a Lifepak 5 heart monitor. Accounts have been opened in the First State Bank in Mobeetie, and the First National Bank in Wheeler where deposits may be made directly. Also donation cans are located at both banks, Anglin's Drug Store and Mobeetie Grocery.

## Kelton School Election Draws Seven Candidates

7 File For 3 Positions for Kelton School Trustee

Five names will appear on the ballot for 2-three year terms and two names will be on the ballot for 1-one year unexpired term. Three places will be filled at the election to be held Saturday, April 4, 1981.

Wayne Bamar, Bob Buckingham, Bob Hink, Mike Hon-eycutt, and Glen Waldo, Sr. have filed for the two three year terms that will expire the first Saturday in April. Bob Hink and Glen Waldo, Sr. are the incumbents for these two positions.

Mike Bryant and George G. Harris have filed for the one year unexpired term. This position was previously held by Gary Clemens with George R. Davis appointed to fill out the term until this April 4 election. Mr. Davis chose not to run for the position.

Absentee balloting is currently underway at the Superintendent's Office at Kelton Schools. The office will be open during the noon hour for

On the day of the election, the polls will open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. The election will be held in the Kelton School Cafetorium.

If at all possible, voters are requested to present their Voter Registration Certificates when voting absentee or on the day of the election. A "Loss of Certificate" affidavit will be available to sign for those voters who have lost their certificate. A list of registered voters will be at the polls for the election officials to use in checking registration.

Those voters registering after September 30, 1980 will definitely have to present their Voter Registration Certificates as the available lists were printed at that time.

## Nine File For Places On Briscoe School Board

## SOME FACTS ABOUT BEEF

With the tremendous array of cuts derived from beef carcasses displayed in the meat market of today, the homemaker many times finds herself in a quandary as to what cut to buy to feed her family.

Let's take a look at the four factors which research has shown to motivate meat shoppers to select the meat they do. According to Dr. Frank A. Orts, Texas Agriculture Meats Specialist, these factors are:

1. Total cost of package—This is normally the largest

discernible figure on the package of meat. The reason the meat shopper looks at the total price is because of the X number of dollars which they have to spend for meat.

2. Ratio of lean to fat and bone—In essence, this is figuring the cost per serving in a roundabout way, thus determining the number of servings which can be obtained from a particular cut of meat. The fat and bone content of any cut can cause the cost per serving to be higher.

3. Appearance of cut—The appearance of the cut in the market has a great influence

on the beef shopper's purchase. Is it a bright or dull color? Are the packages arranged neatly in the self service case? Is there adequate lighting in the market area?

4. Marbling—In some cases beef shoppers do look for some deposits of marbling within the lean tissue (not to be confused with seams of fat between the muscles); however, it is felt that the shopper would be more satisfied with the cooked product if it did contain some marbling rather than no flakes of fat within the lean. These small deposits of fat disappear upon cooking. Even though marbling is not highly related to tenderness, as research conducted by researchers at Texas A&M and many other institutions have shown, it does hold a positive relationship to overall satisfaction with the cooked product.

Along with the above factors in the selection of beef is the Texas love for the flavor, ease of cooking and variety of uses in recipes.

If you are especially interested in beef cookery the Top of Texas Cowbelles is helping promote the Annual Texas Cowbelles Beef Cook-Off. Entry blanks can be obtained at Thriftway grocery. Rules for the cook-off are as follows:

1. A contestant must be at least 18 years old, with a non-professional food status, and be a resident of Texas.

2. Any beef recipe using Chuck, Round, Rump or fresh Brisket cuts of beef in any form may be entered in the Texas Beef Cook-Off. Dish must contain a minimum of two pounds of beef and not more than five pounds of beef. The meat must be exclusively beef.

3. Cooking time is not to exceed four hours, excluding preliminary preparation, such as marinating time.

4. Garnishes on the dish are permissible and should be included in the recipe.

5. The recipe must be specific with no use of brand names, no commercial tenderizers, and must be prepared according to the recipe submitted. State the number of servings and approximate cost per serving.

6. The contestants are responsible for furnishing all ingredients, garnishes and cooking utensils. Ranges will be provided. The contest does not include outdoor cookery.

7. For the preliminary recipe judging, a contestant must submit an entry form and his or her recipe, postmarked no later than April 1, 1981 to the State Chairman at the following address: Texas Cowbelles Beef Cook-off 5501 Interstate 40 West Amarillo, Texas 79106

8. From the recipes submitted, a team of judges will select the top five recipes. The decision of the judges is final.

9. The finalists' expenses will be paid to El Paso to prepare their dishes for judging at the Texas Beef Cook-off May 14-15-16, 1981.

10. The beef dishes will be judged as follows:

- A. Taste—40 points
- B. Appearance—20 points
- C. Originality—20 points
- D. Ease of Preparation/Practicality—20 points

11. All recipes submitted become the property of the





**Electric Vehicles In Operation**

Fifteen small trucks and five compact automobiles which run on electric batteries instead of gasoline have been put into service by General Telephone Company of the Southwest.

Ten of the quarter-ton pickup trucks are part of the fleet at the company's operations at the Dallas/Fort Worth Regional Airport. The other five trucks are used by the Irving Division. The automobiles will be part of the motor pool at the company's general office in San Angelo.

The trucks provide maintenance and repair service transportation for the northern area of General Telephone Company of the Southwest, a part of General Telephone & Electronics.

The electric vehicles will be operated under regular working conditions as part of the electric and hybrid vehicle demonstration program conducted by the U.S. Department of Energy. The company will maintain detailed records on the vehicles and their electrical systems and provide quarterly reports to DOE.

"We expect GTE's participation in the Energy Department's program will help stimulate greater public awareness of electric vehicles and alternate energy sources," said R. Rex Bailey, vice president of General Telephone Company of the Southwest.

The gasoline engines and associated parts are removed from production-line vehicles and replaced by electric motors. Each motor runs on 20 large storage batteries. The vehicles were converted by Jet Industries Inc. of Austin, Texas.

The batteries can be recharged over a period of six to eight hours from a charging unit connected to a 220-volt wall outlet. This provides for a cruising range of at least 50 miles at speeds up to 50 miles per hour.

The charging process consumes about the same amount of energy per hour as 12 hair dryers or 12 household steam irons, according to Bailey.

The 20 vehicles join a growing fleet of electric cars, trucks and vans operated by GTE under the DOE program. By the end of 1981, at least 10 GTE companies will be operating a total of 170 such vehicles.

# GOING OUT WEST

In October 1895 a small blue eyed nine year old boy was waiting at the train station in Jacksboro, Tex., along with all the other kinfolk from far and near.

His fathers cousin, Mary Christian had received a telegram from her oldest son, Jim, who was the ranch foreman of the J.A. ranch, way out in West Texas. He would arrive today, with the body of his nineteen year old brother Bob who was struck by lightning along with his fellow worker. Warren Reed and twenty-two head of cattle, all was killed instantly.

Cousin Mary had so much tragedy in her life, losing her husband when her children were all small, now this. All the relatives wanted to be near her in this new tragedy. Neighbors and friends were at the cemetery digging the grave.

Jim would be on crutches, since he had broken a leg only a few weeks earlier, when a horse fell with him.

The ranch and all the exciting things that happened away out west fired the boys imagination. A dream was born, some day he would see the J.A. ranch that he was hearing so much about since the telegram came.

The long drawn out train whistle was heard in the distance. The boy felt tears well up in his throat, he could barely remember Bob, a handsome boy not much older than himself. As the train came to a shuddering stop Jim appeared in the doorway of a passenger coach. Everyone soon learned the latest heart-breaking news, Bob hadn't been brought back to be buried by his father. The body had been burned to bad to bring home. Jim hadn't realized this when the telegram was sent. He and his cowboy partner were buried near where they were killed, in what is now the Silverton Cemetery where special tribute is paid to their memory every memorial day. The markers are still there that the owners of the J.A. ranch had put at their graves.

Fourteen years later in the early morning light, a young man was hitching his team to a covered wagon. His sixteen year old bride of a few months was already seated on the high spring seat. His younger brother was waiting a few miles down the road. He was going with them. The boys dream was about to be realized. They were starting their

trip to West Texas.

It was the second day before the boys were in completely new country. Late in the afternoon coming to a small creek they pulled off the road ways and made camp. One boy watered and fed the horses, while the other build a campfire and put the coffee pot on. The child bride knew absolutely nothing about cooking on a campfire. This didn't bother the brothers at all. They had batched enough on fobs to be old hands at it. They soon had salt pork frying. A batch of pancakes, or flapjacks as they called them, mixed ready to fry. A can of beans was opened and warmed. They had a bucket of sorgum syrup, they made themselves the fall before to finish the meal on, and washed it all down with coffee that was almost strong enough to float a horseshoe.

The third day was drawing to a close and the young trio

were looking for a place to camp. They spotted a pond not far from the road. There was no fence, so they drove down to it. Angry dark clouds were beginning to gather in the west. The boys hurried to unhitch the team and water and feed them. They wanted to get the camp chores done before it rained. While they were watering the horses a stranger on horseback came up. After greetings, the older man told the weary travelers to come on up to his house, only about a half mile away, and put the wagon and team in his barn, for it did look like it

would storm. The boys started to refuse, when the stranger added, "To tell the truth you would probably help me as much or more than I will you, if you will come. My wife is sick. She can't walk at all, and I don't like the looks of that cloud. We've got a good storm cellar, but not much good if I can't get her in it." ## Tax Statements

TAX STATEMENTS By Charles Buzzard

Two amendments to the Texas Constitution permit agricultural and open-space land to be taxed generally at its productivity value rather than its market value. These provisions are effective only if applications are filed with the tax office in a timely manner.

The first change in the Texas Constitution permits agricultural-use valuation of land. Under this provision, certain qualifications must be met. These include:

1. The land must be owned by a natural person, (not agencies, such as corporations or organizations).
  2. The land must have been in agricultural use for three years prior to claiming this kind of valuation.
  3. The owner must apply for this designation each year.
  4. The owner must file a sworn statement about the use of the land.
  5. The tax assessor must determine that the landowner(s) qualifies.
  6. The agricultural business must be the primary occupation and source of income.
- The second change in the Texas Constitution mandates open space valuation of land. Qualifications for designation under this law are somewhat less strict. Most farmers or ranchers who are unable to qualify for agricultural-use valuation will qualify for open-space land valuation.

Under this provision, the following qualification must be met:

1. The land must be currently devoted principally to agricultural use to the degree of intensity generally accepted in the area.
  2. The land must have been in agricultural use for at least five of the last seven years.
  3. A valid application must be filed each year during the rendition period on a form provided by the tax assessor. For good cause, the tax assessor may extend the deadline for not more than 60 days.
- Under open-space land valuation, there is no requirement that the land be owned by a natural person. Land owned by corporations or partnerships may qualify. The agricultural use need not be the primary occupation or source of income of the owner. A sworn statement is not required.
- Under both the agricultural-use valuation and the open-space whether the applicant qualifies.
- For the next couple of weeks, my column will focus more on the reappraisal that will begin in April.
