

Tax Statements

If your are 65 years of age or older, you are entitled to an additional \$100,000 exemption off the market value of your residence homestead. This exemption applies to school taxes only and you must apply for the exemption before the end of the rendition period,

which is April 1 or April 30. If you qualify for the Over-65 Homestead Exemtion, your school district tax bill cannot increase as long as you apply for the exemtion each year. While your property may increase in vilue through the years, the taxes which you owe in any one year cannot be greater than the amount you Dean's List owed in 1979 or in the first year you qualified for this

exemption, which ever is later. In addition to receiving the \$10,000 exemtion off your school district taxes, you may also receive an additional exemption of not less than \$3,000 off the market value of your residence homestead if your jurisdiction offers this "opt-

ional" exemption. You may not receive both a \$10,000 Over-65 Exemption off the market value of your homestead and \$10,000 Disability Exemption. If you are ment of more than 23,000 qualified for both, you must
