



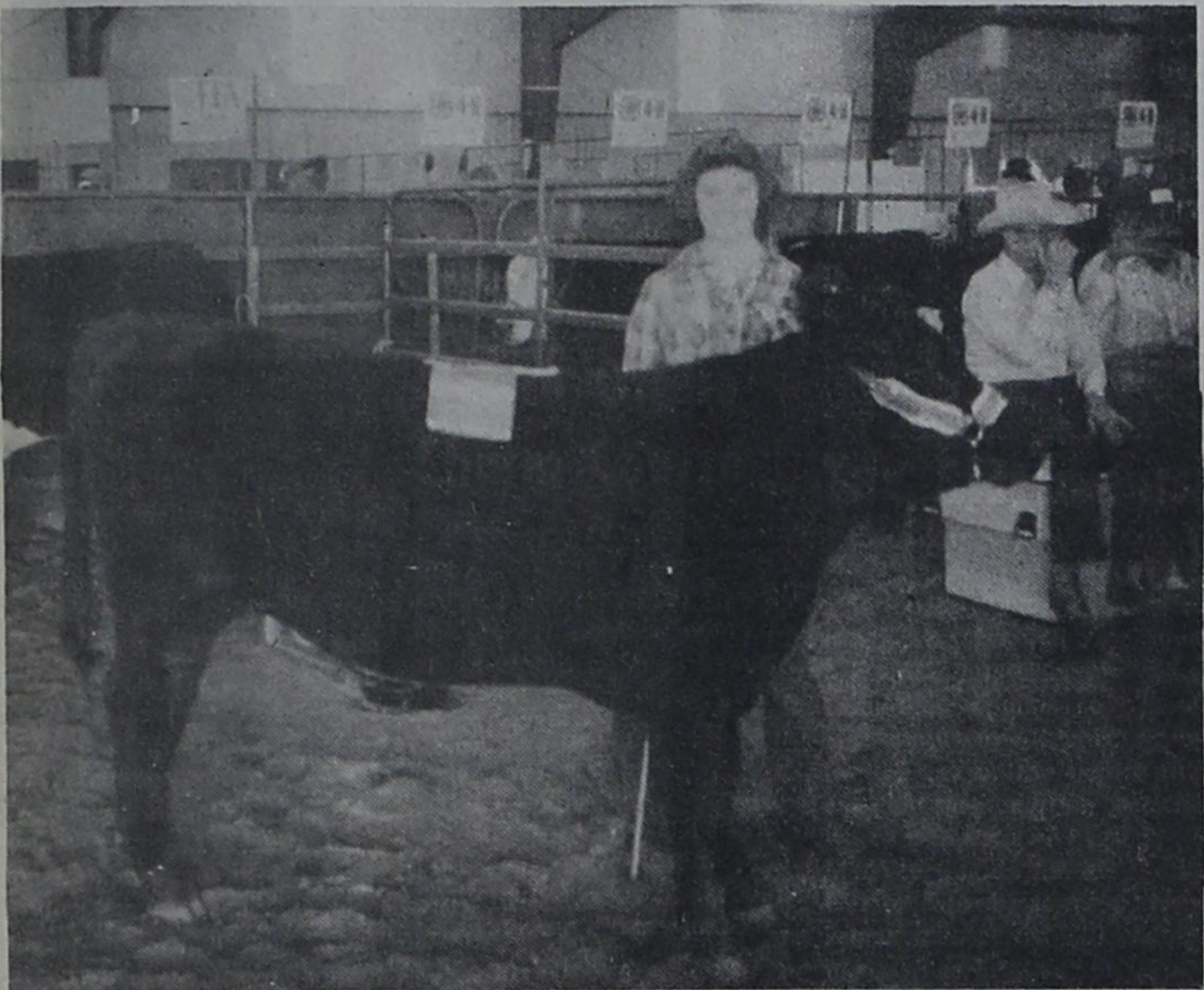

## Arrest Leads To Charges Of Murder Against Pair

An arrest made by Texas Highway Patrolmen, L.B. Snider and L.R. Wardlow on Tuesday, February 24th has resulted in Capital Murder charges being filed in Huntsville, Ala. against the two subjects that were stopped. John Wayne Phillips, 26 and David Allen Tibbetts, 29 of Oklahoma City were stopped just East of Shamrock by Snider and Wardlow after a phone call reported subjects were armed with a pistol.

Investigation showed that the pistol was stolen from a gay bar in Huntsville, Ala., during an armed robbery and double homicide resulting in the death to the bar owner and a barmaid. Further questioning by Deputy Art Allison resulted in the clearing of about 34 burglaries in 4 states, 2 of these burglaries were at the ATEX Service Station east of Shamrock, 2 were of the Vet Clinic in McLean and 1 in Amarillo.

## Rig Accident Hospitalizes One

Bobby Green, 22, of Allison suffered two compound fractures to the leg and a puncture wound to the abdomen Wednesday morning, February 25, as a result of an oil rig accident.

Green was working two miles south and west of Wheeler on the Parker Drilling Rig No. 178. The rig is located on the place owned by Hyland Weaver.

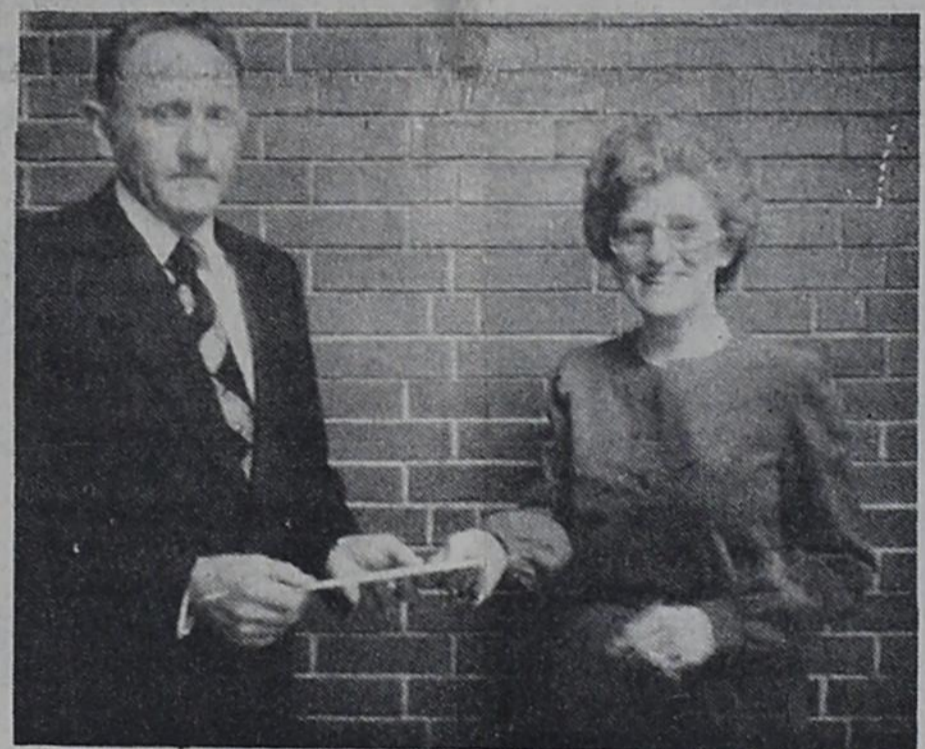
The Wheeler Volunteer Ambulance Service was called to the scene at 9:30 A.M. Green was brought to Parkview where he was treated and transferred to High Plains Baptist Hospital in Amarillo. He was scheduled for surgery Tuesday morning.

Both subjects signed Waivers of Extradition and have been returned to Huntsville, Ala. to face the Capital murder charges there.

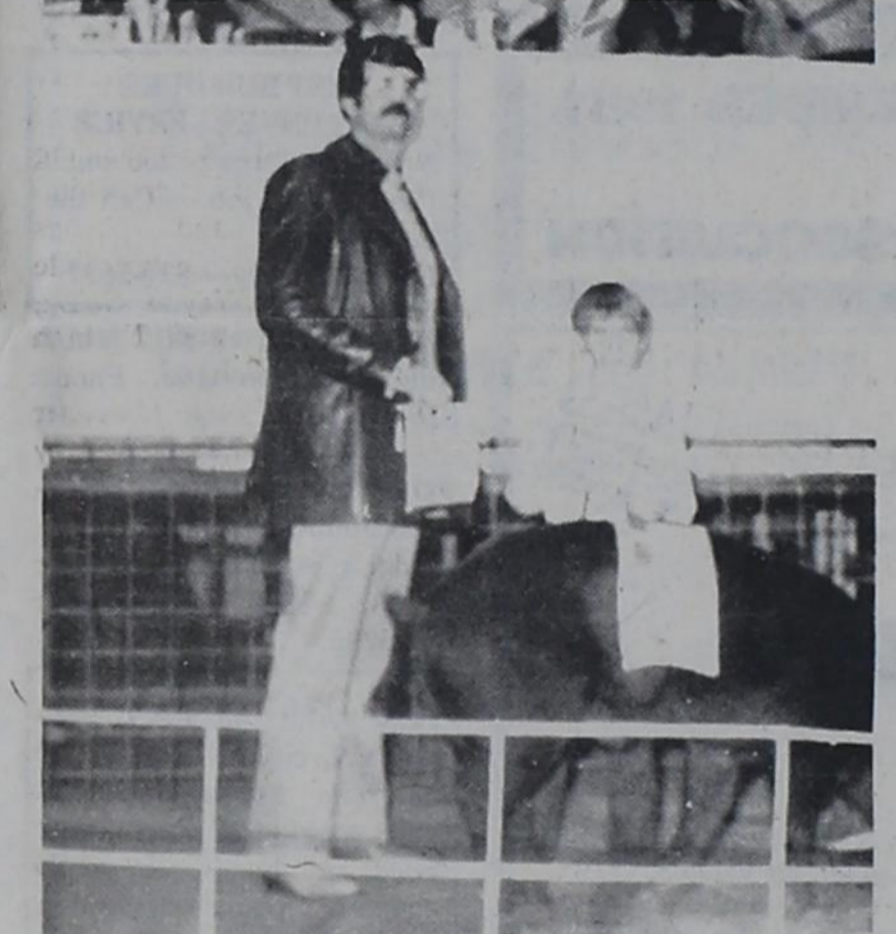
