

Cut or styling will affect the price and fit of jeans, so select the right style for your

Some jeans are cut for the slender figure, while others are fuller through the hips

and thighs. Also, some jeans are cut with flared legs to wear over western boots or have a fashion cut with slim or tapered legs, or have a full "baggy" appearance.

Fashion cuts trend to cost

Some jeans are sized like dresses (9,11,13) while others are sized by waist measurement and may provide a variety of leg lengths.

Because of the variety of sizing and styling, trying on jeans in the store is essential. to obtain proper fit.

Since cotton denim tends to conform to the figure, select jeans that fit snugly when new for a close fit when wearing.

Also, denim tends to contract when washed but expand with wearing. This may make freshly washed jeans uncomfortably tight when first put

DETAILING

Construction details can add to the quality of jeans and may affect price. Flat felled seams, generally used on jeans, leave no raw seam edges to ravel. These seams are characterized by a double row of stitching which totally encases the seam allowance.

Seams not flat felled should be zig zagged or serged to prevent raveling. Check that seams are firmly stitched and neatly constructed.

Interfacing or double thickness at the waistband helps reduce stretching. Look for thread bar tacks or rivets at places of stress like pocket corners, belt loops and bottom of zipper placket.

Also, check for a quality, furable zipper which zips eas-

Special designs such as embroidery or geometric stitching on the pocket ot other pant areas will add to the cost, especially when associated with a certain brand or designer.

BRAND

In most cases, a designer trademark will add at least \$10 to the price of the jeans. STORE TYPE

Jeans bought in specialty stores or fashion boutiques will cost more, but these stores generally offer the latest in fashion styling.

Chain stores and discount stores buy in greater quantities, so the consumer usually pays less at these stores.



Along the way between Wheeler and Pampa we came to a stone building with a small sign, "Old Mobeetie Jail and Museum." Mobeetie was the stage station from the Fort Worth area to Dodge City in

What impressed me most was in front of the jail. A patched-up flagpole and on top, proudly standing straight out in the wind was Old Glory above the Texas State flag. There were guy wires holding it up. The old flagpole was taken from Ft. Elliott which had once existed about a mile to the northwest.

Old Texas history came to

life as I read on the plaques below the flag of J. J. Long, 1875, who had established the Fort to protect the Texas Panhandle from the Indians, of Temple Lea Houston who gave the dedicatory speech for the Texas Capitol in 1888, Frank Willis, Sr. 1881-90, first judge of the 35th district, coming to Texas in search of new horizons, Capt. G. W. Arrington 1844-1923, a great peace officer of era of early settlement in the Texas Panhandle and lived near this site. He was one of the most daring scouts in the famous Guerrilla comand of col. John S. Mosby in Virginia. He settled in Texas in 1867, became a Texas Ranger and had an outstanding record. With courage and distinction he served 1882-90 as sheriff of Wheeler and 14 attached counties. Emanuel Dubbs was the last one I read of on the plaques 1843-1929 and first county judge in the Panhandle He came to know Texas as a buffalo hunter and was famous in the Battle of Adobe Walls 1874. He gained wide respect when as a judge he had a lawless U.S. Marshall Arrest-I looked into the old jail

which was dated 1886, the first iail in the Panhandle of Texas. It was the central holding place for badmen. It was built of native stone at the cost of \$18,500, including \$1200 for the hangman's device put in to meet state requirements.

As I entered the little building I was met by the custodian. She was a gracious lady, her age doubtful, but her eyes were as blue as the sky and her silk weathered by the scorching sun, sand and wind, yet she held the semblance that she was once very beautiful. She related that her husband had died a number of years ago leaving her with two children. She decided she would attempt to keep the museum custodian job and was doing quite well. I noticed how neat and clean and orderly were the memorabilia and I wanted to hear more of her life here on the plains.

I ventured to look into the tiny cubicle of the famous hangman's noose. It was startling to see a western figure hung by his neck facing

The old rock jail had been restored and the rooms furnished as nearly as possible to the style of the 1880's when the sheriff and family had lived here.

In May 1898 Mobeetie had suffered a tornado, killing 6 people and leaving few buildins standing. The old jail was built in 1909.

Now, once a year, a festival is held on a makeshift stage behind the jail. It is call "Old Settler's Reunion", held on Labor Day weekend on the old courthouse square, with a picnic, speakers, music and singing. The Mobeetie Little Theater presents a play, "Old Mobeetie," on the outdoor

As I left the area, I again looked at that dear old flag flying bravely over this lonely country on it's patched up pole. It also had a history. The pole had stood about a mile away at Ft. Elliott. In 1875, J. J. Long established the Fort to protect the Texas Panhandle from Indians. He was a teamster merchant who arrived with the soldiers and was hired to provide the flagpole for the fort in Cedar Breaks near Antelope Hills, 90 miles away. He cut two huge trees and hauled them by wagon to build the 50 ft. flagpole. Later, it was brought to Ft. Elliott. When Ft. Elliott closed in 1890, Long brought the pole and placed it in front of his store. Later it stood at Mobeetie school for 20 years and in 1949, at last came to it's resting place at the Mobeetie jail museum.
