

The APC's will be set up much the same way for reimbursement for outpatient treatment. At this point there have been 451 APC's established, and outpatient treatment will be reimbursed according to the APC's that the patient's treatment falls into. The system for reimbursement will change, but the levels of care available will not change. We will still have available the medical observation, DRG acute care admissions, and swing bed admissions. This will, however, effect our reimbursement, and the proper coding will be very important in getting the APC's working effectively. A later report on this will be forthcoming.






