A.C.T. Test **Dates** Listed

Juniors and seniors who are thinking of going on to school after graduation will want to take note of a recent announcement by Dewey Shepard, Wheeler counselor, about the national test date schedule for the ACT Assessment Program.

Shepard reproted that students who want to take the ACT on the first 1980-81 national test date, October 18, must have their registration materials completed and mailed before the September 19 deadline. The full 1980-81 schedule of test dates and deadlines is as follows:

Test Dates: October 18, 1980, December 13, 1980, February 14, 1981, March 28, 1981, June 13, 1981.

Registration Deadlines: September 19, November 14, January 16, February 27, May 15.

The basic student fee for using the ACT Assessment is \$8.50. At area test centers on national test dates it will take students about three hours to complete the four exams (English, math, social studies, and natural sciences) that make up the ACT. Information reports resulting from the tests are sent to the students and their high school counselors, as well as to those colleges designated by the students.
