Habitat Is Key To Wildlife Population

The harsh winters of West
Texas will eliminate wildlife on
property lacking proper cover.
Extensive overgrazing has dis-
placed desirable tall and mid-
grass cover and forb food species
grass cover and forb food species
occuring on both the high plains

and rolling plains. Results of
overgrazing on wildlife species
such as the game birds includes a
such as the game birds includes a
marked decrease of desirable
weed food plants and destruction
of both nesting and escape cover.
During the winter, cultivated
graiin sorghums are readily avail-
able to most game birds such as
the quail, prairie chicken and
the quail, prairie chicken and
pheasant. But, many agricultur

al practices such as clean farm-
ing, burning of crop stubble,
