

#### Rainfal Recording the rainfall for

the month of july in Wheeler was not too difficult this year. One rain was enough to measure: 0.6 was measured July 21. The amounts over the area varied on the 21st with some reporting close to an inch in Mobeetie area. A few sprinkles fell a couple of other dates, but not enough to measure.

In comparison, July of 1979 produced 1.70 inches of moisture and in 1978 Wheeler received 2.28 for the month.

Only 0.08" was recorded for the month of June.

For the year, Wheeler has received 9.45" of rain in 1980. This compares with 13.73 for the same period in 1979.
