This is the most diversified technical beef cattle training that can be provided at the state level so we would like to encourage all beef producers to attend. Participants have the opportunity to attend Beef Production Seminars covering the topics of "Basic Ranch Management," "Current Breeding Programs and Future Potential," "Reproductive Techniques to Add Value to Cattle," Grazing Management," and "Nutritional Management of Calves, Stockers, and Cows." Agricultural management workshops include "Website and Internet Marketing," and "Analysis: the Key to Cow-Calf Business Management-SPA, Accounting, and Production Records Review." Beef production workshops, which use hands-on training, will address such topics as "Beef Cattle Management Working Demonstration," "Beef Cattle Judging and Selection Demonstration," "Veterinary Techniques of Beef Herd Physical Examination Demonstration," and "Beef carcass Evaluation Workshop." 

Odessa Mooney Travels To Attend Family Events


