Funeral services for 90 year old 5-2 Katy Baumgardner were held 5-15 Monday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock 5-17 in the First Baptist Church in 5-22 Mobeetie with the Rev. John 5-25 Hansard, local minister officiat-

Mrs. Baumgardner died 5-28 Thursday, May 29, in her home in Orem Utah, where she lived 5-29 for several years. Born August 11, 1889, in Lee County Virginia, Mrs. Gaumgradner was a member of the Mobeetie Baptist 5-30 Church. On September 2, 1906 5-31 Katy Melissa Eleanor Pickle was married to Nathan Lee Baumgardner in Greenville, Texas. They moved to Lefors in 1930 and to Mobeetie in 1950 where they lived several years. After Mr. Baumgardner's death she moved to Pampa, where she lived for some twenty years.

Survivors include three daughters, Katy Lee Shcakelford of Pampa, Emma Lou Ross of Provo, Utah and Eddie maud Shannon of Orem, Utah; one son, James M. Baumgardner of Grand Prairie, Texas; fifteen grandchildren and twenty-two great-grandchildren.



Allison is estimated at \$55,000. Mobil homes suffered most from the storm; nine were completely destroyed in Allison. visible damage to the relatively new school system was minor with possible structural damage involved. the gin sustained heavy damage and six box cars were derailed.

North and east of Allison the cloud contined its destruction. An additional 15 homes were damaged or destroyed. Two drilling sites received damage and several outbuildings were

The citizens of Allison are to be commended for their quick action by the storm were accounted for. The families living in most of the trailer homes chose that particular evening to be away and many returned home to find nothing left of their trailer or belongings. Three men were injured at Parkers rig no. 1-64 on Bowers Ranch. The rig is located 4 miles south and 31/2 east of Allison. The trailer at the site was totally demolished as were the other building surrounding the rig. The three occupants of the trailer. were injured and taken to Parkview Hospital in Wheeler by the Wheeler Ambulance. Robert Dickinson of Borger received broken ribs and possibly a puncured lung. Toby Skaggs of Perryton was badly bruised and received a cut above the left eye. Bynn England of Borger was released following examination at Parkview. Dickenson and Skaggs were transfered to St. Anthony's May 29.





ture. (TDA), APHIS, TDA and the land owner each pay one third of the cost of spraying. Teh cost toh the landowner should be about 70 cents per acre this year. Only range land and pastureland can be sprayed; cropland is

not eligible. To qualify for the program there must be at least 10,000 acres in a sprayable block. The program is using 8 oz. of malathion per acre. Although no kill rates are guaranteed, a kill rate of 60-70 percent can be

expected in tall grass range with some brush. Kill rates can be high as 90-95 percent on smooth, short-grass range. More than 7 million acres are expected to be infested in Texas this year and TDA has funds to spray 1.5 million acres - Therefore, it is important that land be signed up as soon as possible. A

cut off date of June 3 has been

set. By that date the land to be

sprayed must be ploted on a map and money collected and on deposit in a bank. Any producer who would like to sign up land to be sprayed or would like further information should contact Don King, CEA at 826-5243 or 826-3249 after office
