MORE ABOUT BOOKS, Etc. Wheeler Public Library Wanda King, Librarian

The Library Board met in the Library Tuesday, February 12, 1980, with 15 of the 17 members present. During discussion it was brought up that a list of lending rules needed to be posted in the library and publicized so that patrons, especially new ones, would know what they

1. People with out of the area addresses would have to put up a cash deposit covering the cost of items being checked out. The deposit would be returned when the item loaned was returned.

2. Interlibrary loan, films, etc. will have return postage paid in advance by patron prior to receiving item. (Prior to this, the library absorbed this postage cost, and found it was not financially able to continue to do so.) (Average cost per book is 20 - 25 cents and films - \$1.00.) The loan of the material is free. The return postage is the only charge, unless the item is returned late then the fine is 5 cents a day.

3. NO ONE will have the privilege of checking out any material if they already have a fine on the books. The fines must be paid in full.
