WHEELER MUSTANGS BRING HOME CLASS 'B' STATE CHAMPIONSHIP



1979 CLASS 'B' STATE FOOTBALL CHAMPS

It was a long hard journey that started back in August and ended on a chilly night in central Texas before more than 2000 fans as the never say die Wheeler Mustangs came from behind twice and whipped the High Island Cardinals 33-21 to win the 1979 Class B state football championship.

The victory in Cleburne brought back the crown to the Panhandle and gave the Mustangs their second state championship in football in three straight trips to the big game.

WINNERS ARE NAMED IN SATURDAY'S DRAWING

The Wheeler Merchants held their second drawing of the year Saturday afternoon and the size of the crowd had increased over that of the previous week. \$1,000 will be given away over the period of three weeks; \$300 will be handed out at each of the first two drawings and \$400 will be given at the third drawing Saturday, December 22.

Dollar, 26, died of smoke inhalation suffered in a fire which destroyed the small rental home he shared with another oil field worker at Custer City.

Ron Ferguson, chief of the Custer City Volunteer Fire Department, said flames were shooting out of the roof of the home when firemen answered the call at 7:15 a.m. Sunday.

Bobcat Tagging

Texas trappers and fur dealers are advised by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department that its bobcat pelts tagging program will continue despite a federal court order temporarily banning the export of bobcat pelts from the U.S.

The Defenders of Wildlife, Inc. (DOW) has filed suit in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against the Endangered Species Scientific Authority (ESSA), the federal agency which issues export licenses for bobcat pelts, alleging that continuation of the current licensing policy would be detrimental to the survival of the species.

Judge June L. Green issued a temporary restraining order effectively banning export of bobcat pelts and products taken in the U.S. during the 1979-80 season, pending the outcome of a hearing set for Dec. 3-5.

Ted Clark, the department's Wildlife Division Director, said there are no plans to modify the current tagging requirements in Texas at this time, pending the outcome of the litigation. The bobcat pelt tagging period is Nov. 15-Feb. 15.

Clark pointed out that Texas asked for, and received, an unlimited quota of bobcat pelt tags from the ESSA for the current season. "The resource is being managed," Clark said. "Bobcats are found in significant numbers virtually throughout Texas and they have not been threatened by hunting or trapping."

He added that even if the export ban stays in effect throughout the season, the pelts still will be legal for domestic sale. Prices, however, may be affected if international sales are stopped, he said.


