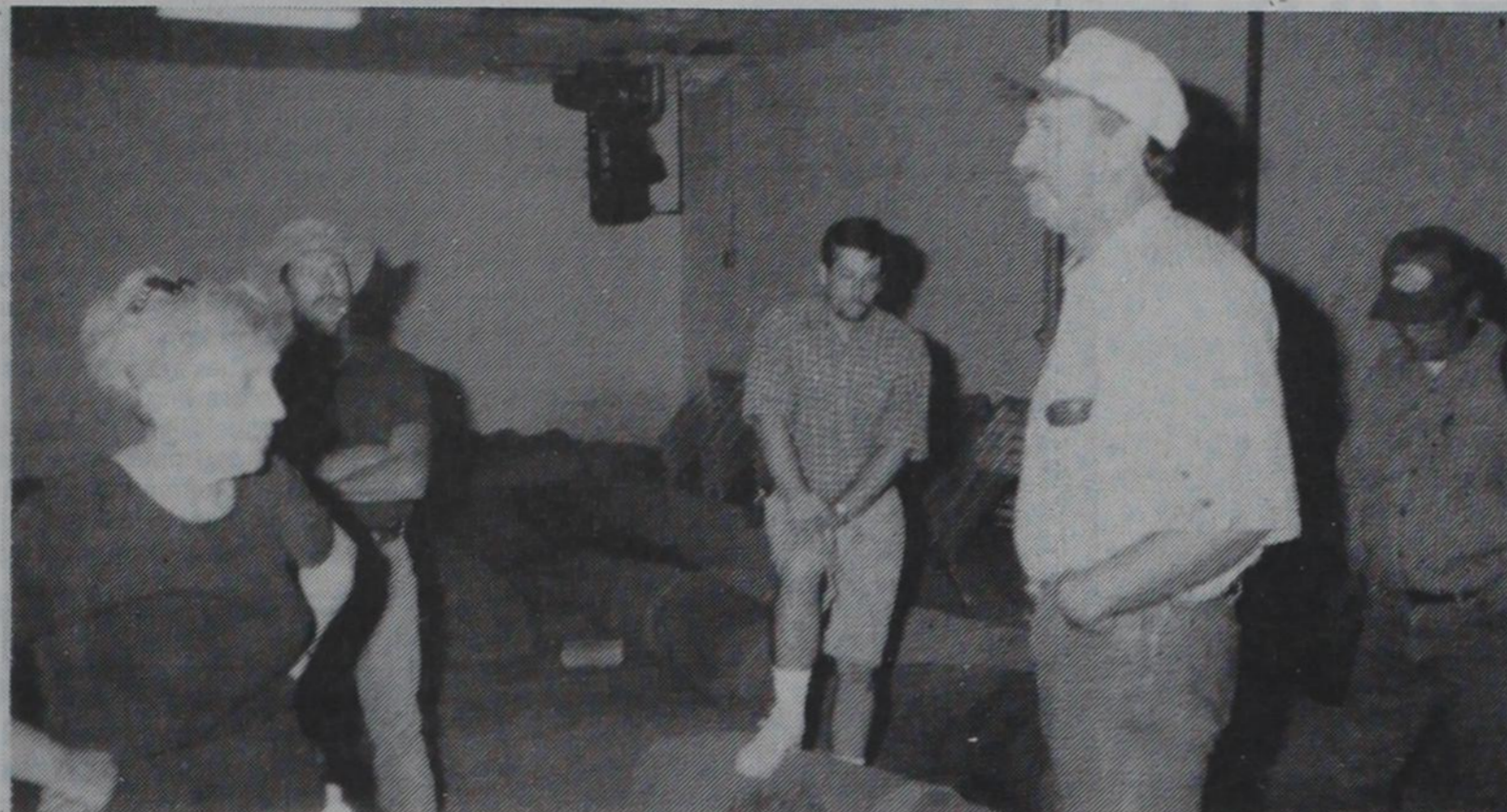

The Wheeler County Commissioners court met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Monday, August 14, 2000, in the Commissioners Court Room, Wheeler County Courthouse, Wheeler, Texas.

Thirteen items were on the agenda. The minutes were approved and the bills passed for payment.

The J.P. Reports were given and accepted. Brady Meadows reported \$962.50 and Art Taylor reported \$49,363.87.

The Commissioners approved the laying of a telephone cable across a county road in Precinct No. 2.

A resolution for Panhandle Tourism Marketing Council was adopted by the commissioners. The resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WHEELER, TEXAS IN SUPPORT OF THE DIVISION OF THE CURRENT PLAINS TRIALS REGION, AS DESIGNATED BY THE TEXAS STATE HISTORICAL COMMISSION'S TRAVEL TRAILS PROGRAM, INTO TWO SEPARATE AND DISTINCT REGIONS TO BE KNOWN AS THE "SOUTHERN PLAINS TRAIL" AND THE "NORTHERN PLAINS TRAIL".

WHEREAS, Wheeler County supports efforts to promote tourism and economic development in the South Plains and Northern Plains regions; and

WHEREAS, a group of representatives from 22 South

Plains counties has formed the "South Plains Heritage Trails Consortium" for the purpose of developing Heritage Tourism Trails across the South Plains regions; and

WHEREAS, a group of representatives from 26 Northern Plains counties has formed the "Panhandle Tourism Marketing Council" for the purpose of economic development through tourism across the Northern Plains region; and

WHEREAS, both organizations desire to further develop and expand heritage trails programs in their own regions to collectively include all 52 counties designated in the current Plains Trail region, in full cooperation with one another, but functioning as separate and distinct entities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF THE COUNTY OF WHEELER:

THAT the Wheeler County Commissioner's Court on behalf of Wheeler County, Texas supports and endorses efforts to divide the current 52 county Plains Trail Region as designated by the Texas Historical Commission's Travel Trails program, into separate northern and southern regions to be known as the "Northern Plains Trail" and the "Southern Plains Trail" respectively, as designated on the attached map. The purpose of the requested division is to allow operation and funding of each region as a separate and distinct entity, thus enabling the most effective and effective and efficient use of resources for the promotion and further development of heritage tourism in the current 52 county Plains Trails region.

COMMUNITY BUILDING PROPOSAL IS PRESENTED TO WHEELER CITY COUNCIL

Harrison Hall was on the agenda for the City of Wheeler Council meeting, Monday, August 21, 2000. A conflict forced the meeting date to be moved to Monday, August 14.

Harrison and several members of the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce met with the council for the purpose of discussing the restoration of the American Legion Building to be used as a community center. The city council was being asked to agree to accept ownership and maintenance of the facility, if it were made available.

Harrison proposed a maintenance tax be enacted to be used for the maintenance of building the city now oversees—Library, Swimming Pool and City Offices and Fire Department (insurance on buildings and fire trucks).

"Wheeler needs a community center; there are 100 functions the building could be used for," stated Ben Ed Hillhouse. Graduation is presently in the gym—poor cooling and inefficient sound system. Community functions, such as the chamber banquet are held in the school cafeteria; the legion's main room is over 1 1/2 times as large. Shamrock's community building is used 40 weeks out of the year. A usage fee could be charged to help defray expenses. In closing his comments, Hillhouse stated he is a member of the 501C3, which is an organization presently working on ways to fund the project.

The council was also reminded that the Legion is a part of Wheeler's heritage. The building is structurally sound and cannot be replaced for the amount needed for repairs.

Those in attendance were not asking the city to purchase the building or make the repairs—the city council needs to accept ownership.

A special meeting of the council was set for 4:30 p.m. Tuesday at the American Legion Building for the purpose of looking over the structure.

Bob McCain made motion seconded by Walter Simmons to re-appoint Harrison Hall to the surface water board. The motion carried.

The council went into executive session at 8:15 p.m. The Council returned from executive session at 8:26 p.m. (pursuant to art. 551 Texas Government Code.) Barbra Koelzer made motion seconded by Kathleen Frankenbery the meeting adjourn.

John and Frances Collins left for home this week. They did some work on their house here while they were here. They will be coming home more often now. They have got their house in Lake Isabel CA lease for two years.

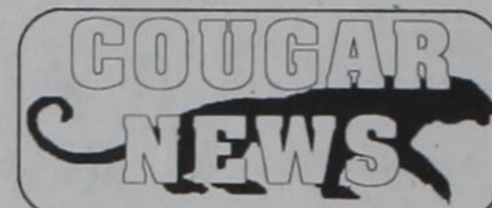

Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in tax rate or property value.

Notice of Rollback Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is 1.47. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the rollback rate of 1.47.

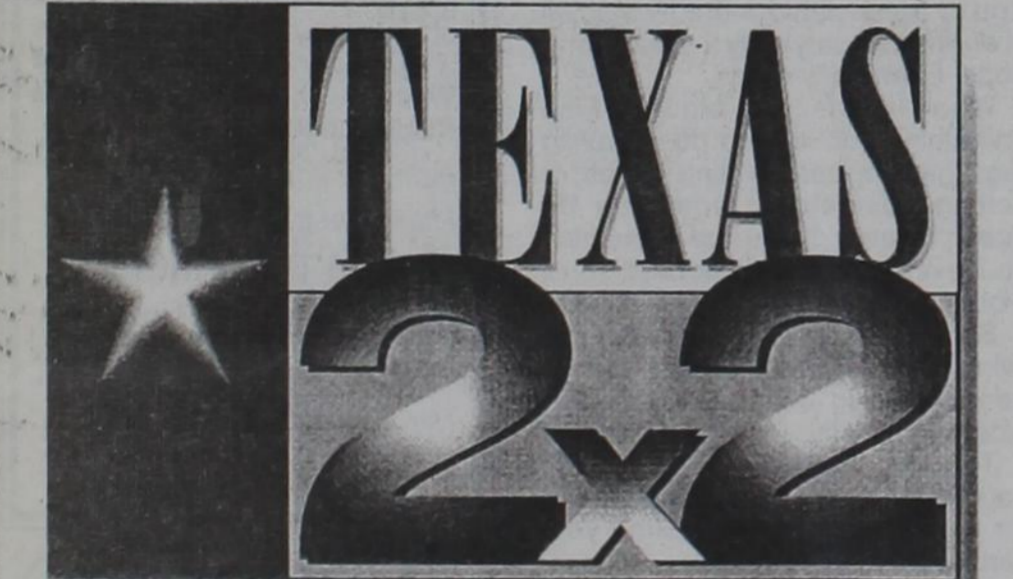
