
### **DID JESUS COME?**

Yet it is equally an impassioned revelation of the joys and hazards of love, physical and spiritual, of the fortitude demanded to confront adversity, of the faith needed to make misfortune endurable, of the bittersweet folly of fantasy and selfdelusion, and of the triumphs possible for those who seek and follow their own truths.


