Parkview Hospital Board Meeting; Employee Pay Increase Requested

DECEMBER 10, 2007

Chairman Thomas Helton called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room of Parkview Hospital.

Present: Thomas Helton, Chairman; Sue Chandler, Vice Chairman; Ray Hudson and Dale Garner.

Absent: James Batton, Secretary

Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, CEO and Sue Stiles, RN, BSN, Director of Nursing

Dale Garner made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 2007 meeting. Ray Hudson seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Dale Garner made a motion to approve payment of the bills. Motion was seconded by Sue Chandler and carried unanimously.

Chairman Helton moved the agenda to New Business to allow Mrs. Stiles to make a presentation to the Board. Mrs. Stiles discussed our successes in the past year as well as the dedication of our staff to Parkview Hospital. She also presented information on salaries and paid holidays for similar salaried positions that she and Ms. Fagan Cook hold with the hospital. She presented facts and figures that included the increase to minimum wage through July 2009. At this time she requested that all employees receive a pay increase of 4% and that all salaried employees receive an 8% increase. Dale Garner asked what this would do to the budget over a year's time. Ms. Fagan Cook reported it would be a total increase of \$82,500. Dale Garner made a motion to

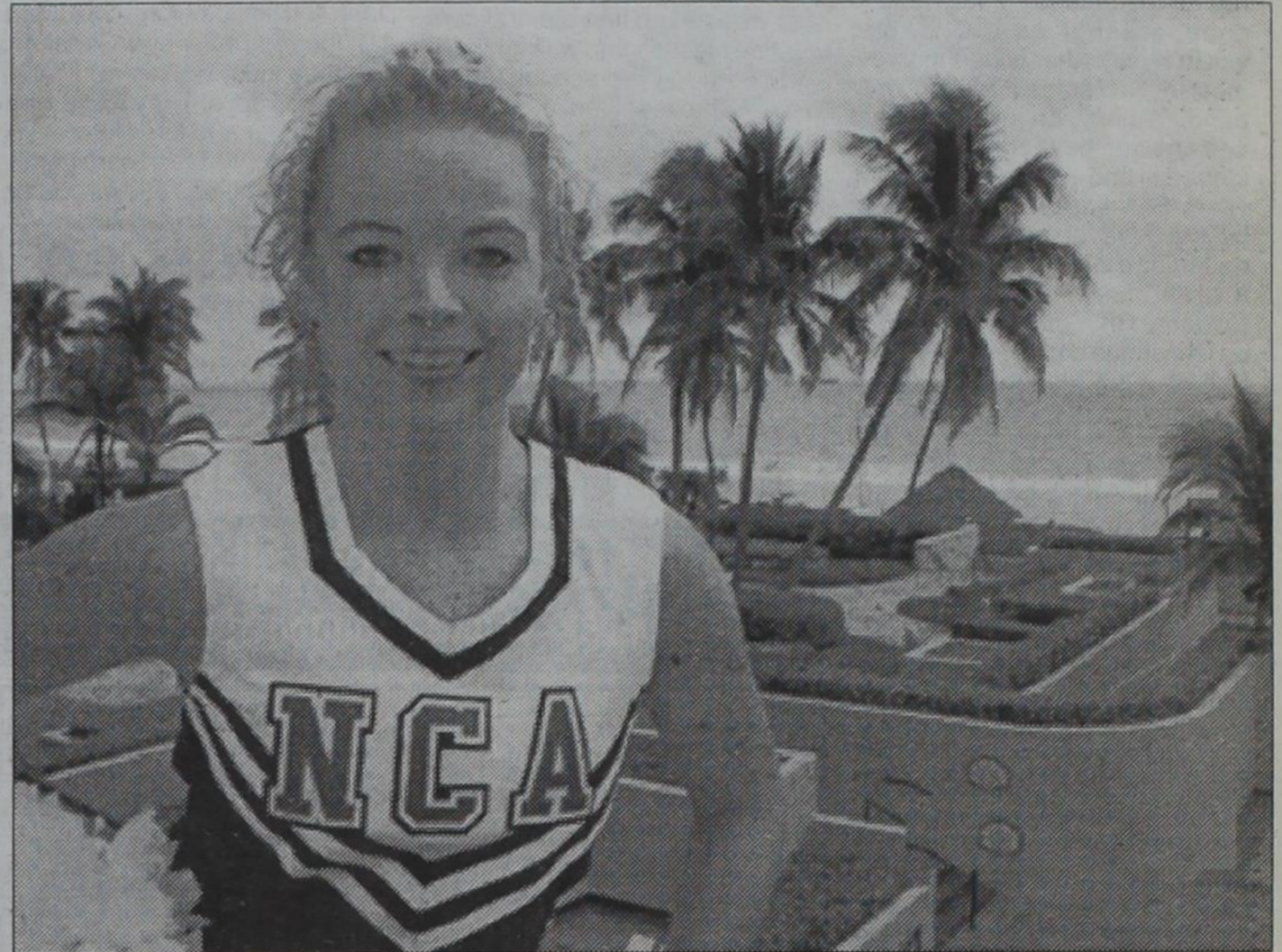
give the requested increases beginning with the first payroll in January and to give the two additional paid holidays to salaried employees. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. Mrs. Stiles left the meeting at 6:42 p.m.

Chairman Helton returned to Agenda Item 4. Ms. Fagan Cook presented financial statements investment report and statistics for the month. She also stated that the MMA account to which taxes are deposited pays 1.79 percent interest. Since we have collected a large amount of taxes and received our cost report reimbursement she recommended that the Board purchase some additional CDs in order to receive more interest. She gave current CD rates for both banks. Ray Hudson made a motion to buy additional CDs with whichever bank that has the highest interest rate. Dale Garner seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. Ms. Fagan Cook reported that there were no bad debts or charity writeoffs this month.

QAPI minutes and scorecards were reviewed in detail. Dale Garner made a motion to accept the reports as presented. Ray Hudson seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook reported that she still had not received the bids for the cover over the back door area. She also requested that the board approve several changes to our credit and collection policy. Dale Garner made the motion to approve the changes. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the

Bobby Royce Vanpool, 59, died Sunday, January 6, 2008, in Wheeler, Texas. Services were held at 10:30 A.M., Tuesday, January 8, 2008, in the First Baptist Church, Wheeler, Texas, with Rev. Rodney Weatherly of Dalhart, Texas, officiating. Burial was in the Wheeler Cemetery, Wheeler, Texas, under the direction of Wright Funeral Home, Wheeler, Texas.

Bobby passed away in his home on January 6, 2008. Born to the late A.O. "Bud" and Novella Vanpool on November 29, 1948, in Wheeler, Bobby attended kindergarten through 12th grade at Wheeler Public Schools where he excelled in football and track and still holds the school record in the 100-yard dash. After graduation in 1967, he served his country in Vietnam as an Army tank commander of the "Dusters" with Battery B, 4th Battalion, 60th Artillery. During his service, he earned and was awarded the Bronze Star for Valor. Upon his return, Bobby met and married his soul-mate, Carolyn Sue Fischer, also of Wheeler, on February 9, 1973. Together, they had three children:

Eric, Lori, and Amy.

Bobby was an active member of the community serving on the Cemetery Board, the City Council and as an officer of the Wheeler VFW post. He was employed by the Natural Gas Pipeline Company of America for 33 years based in Laketon, TX., where he was foreman in charge of pipeline and plant operations for the Eastern Panhandle and Western Oklahoma regions. Bobby was an avid fisherman and loved to spend time on his farm, the Lazy V, hunting quail and deer. Most of all, he loved spending time with his grandchildren.

Bobby is survived by his wife, Sue, of the home; his son, Eric Vanpool, and his wife, Kerri, of Tuttle, OK.; his daughter, Lori Bragg, of Moore, OK.; his daughter, Amy Carter, and her husband, Kamron, of Oklahoma City, OK.; his brother, Terry Vanpool, and his wife, Judy, of Mansfield, TX.; his sister, Becky Garrett, and her husband, Larry, of San Antonio, TX.; seven grandchildren; and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.

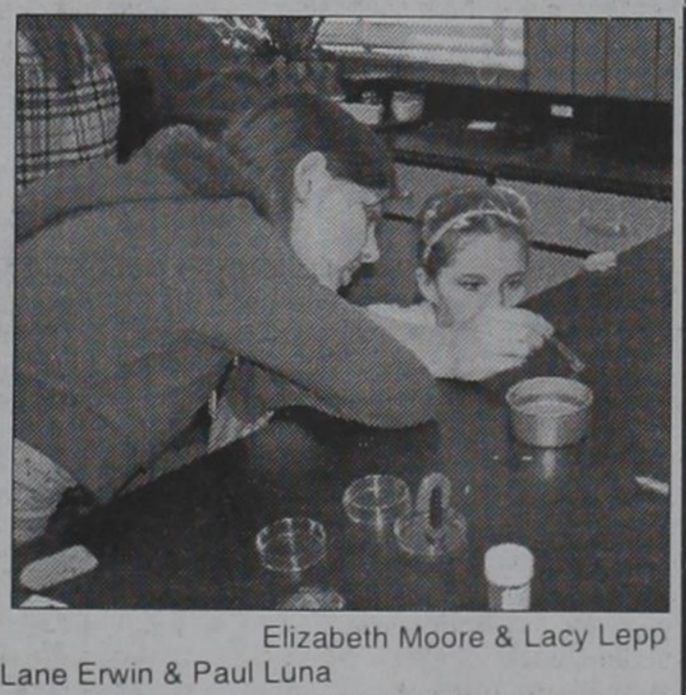
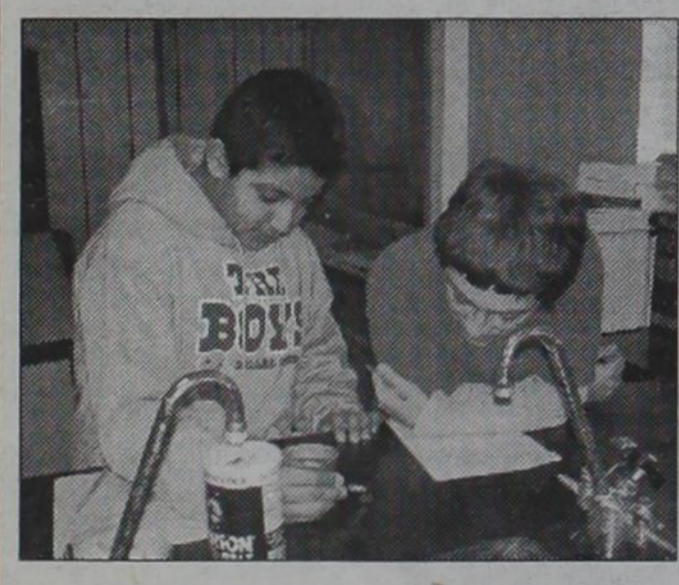


