





The kettle should have a rack to hold jars off the bottom and be deep enough for the water to come over the jars one to two inches with a remaining head space of one to two inches. It should also have a tight-fitting

Process the okra for 20 minuntes. Start to count processing time as soon as hot jars are placed in actively boiling water.

Remove jars and place on a rack to cool out of a draft. The next day after processing, remove rings. Wash and dry jars and store in cool place.

Note: The okra will be shriveled immediately after removal from the water bath, but after several day swill absorb the liquid and become plump once
