### ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING

On this 28th day of August, 2000, the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in Regular Session, and finds that circumstances present in all the unincorporated area of Wheeler County, Texas create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning, therefore;

The Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by this order hereby prohibits outdoor burning in all of the unincorporated area in Wheeler County, Texas. This burn ban takes effect SEPTEMBER 1, 2000, and will terminate DECEMBER 1, 2000, NINETY (90) days from that date.

A person who violates this prohibition will be charged with a Class C misdemeanor pursuant to Section 240.906 of the Texas Local Government Code.

### COUNTY WIDE BURN BAN ADOPTED SPECIFIC RESTRICTIONS IMPLEMENTED

The Wheeler County Commissioners Court adopted a County Wide Burn Ban EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2000, THROUGH DECEMBER 1, 2000. Specific Restrictions will apply. Those producers wishing to burn crop residue on land designated for Ag use will have to follow the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission guide lines as set out below AND contact the local sheriff's office or police department BEFORE ANY burning may be done.

**GUIDELINES:**  
1. Burning shall be commenced and conducted only when wind direction and other meteorological conditions are such that smoke and other pollutants will not cause adverse effects to any public road, landing strip, navigable water, or off-site structure containing sensitive receptor(s).  
2. If at any time the burning causes or may tend to cause smoke to blow onto or across a road or highway, it is the responsibility of the person initiating the burn to post flag-persons on effected roads.  
3. Burning shall be conducted in compliance with the following meteorological and timing conditions:

a. The initiation of burning shall commence no earlier than one hour after sunrise. Burning shall be completed on the same day not later than one hour before sunset, and shall be attended by a responsible party at all times during the active burn phase when the fire is progressing. In cases where residual fire and/or smoldering objects continue to emit smoke after this time, such areas shall be extinguished if the smoke from these areas has a potential to create a nuisance or traffic hazard conditions. In no case shall the extent of the burn area be allowed to increase after this time.  
b. Burning shall not be commenced when surface wind speed is predicted to be less than six miles per hour (mph) (five knots) or greater than 23 mph (20 knots) during the burn period.  
c. Burning shall not be conducted during periods of actual or predicted persistent low level atmospheric temperature inversions.

**111.221 Responsibility for Consequences of Outdoor Burning.**  
THE AUTHORITY TO CONDUCT OUTDOOR BURNING UNDER THIS REGULATION DOES NOT EXEMPT OR EXCUSE ANY PERSON RESPONSIBLE FROM THE CONSEQUENCES, DAMAGES, OR INJURIES RESULTING FROM THE BURNING AND DOES NOT EXEMPT OR EXCUSE ANYONE FROM COMPLYING WITH ALL OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS OR ORDINANCES, REGULATIONS, AND ORDERS OF GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES HAVING JURISDICTION, EVEN THOUGH THE BURNING IS OTHERWISE CONDUCTED IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS REGULATION.

### Rites are August 26 For Tyson Shelton, 80

Tyson Shelton, 80, a former Mobeetie resident, died Wednesday, August 23, 2000. Services were at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, August 26, 2000 in First Baptist Church with the Rev. Neal Helmbacher and the Rev. Doc Ware officiating. Burial with military honors was in Fairlawn Cemetery in Elk City, Oklahoma, under the direction of Martin Funeral Home.

Mr. Shelton was born at Mobeetie and graduated from Mobeetie High School. He attended West Texas State Teacher's College at Canyon. He married Juanita Allen in 1940. He established a plumbing, contractor business in Amarillo, relocating the business to Elk City in 1959, where he continued to operate it until 1981. He became a building inspector for the city of Elk City in 1986.

He was a member of Elk City Lions Club, Western Oklahoma Historical Society and Far West Fiddlers. He was a deacon at First Baptist Church.

During World War II, he received a Purple Heart, while serving in the U. S. Army in the South Pacific, Okinawa and the Philippines.

Survivors include his wife, Juanita; two daughters, Sharon Stalcup of Gallup, N.M., and Rhonda Mikles of Elk City; two sons, Allen L. Shelton of Houston and Tyson Lynn Shelton of Gallup; two sisters, Lillie Mae Bailey of Mobeetie and Juanell Elberting of Albuquerque, N.M.; a brother, Joe Merle Shelton of Mobeetie; 10 grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

Slushy Punch  
1 cup sugar  
1—3 oz. pkg. Jello  
1 cup boiling water

4 cups cold water  
1 tall can pineapple juice—46 ozs.  
1—2 liter bottle gingerale.  
I dissolved Jello in boiling water and added sugar. Then 4 cups cold water and pineapple juice. Mix well and freeze in ice cream bucket or other gallon size container. Thaw about 3 or 4 hours before serving and add the gingerale just before serving. Stir to mix up to a slush. I used black cherry jello to make burgundy punch. But any color and flavor could be used such as lime, strawberry, or

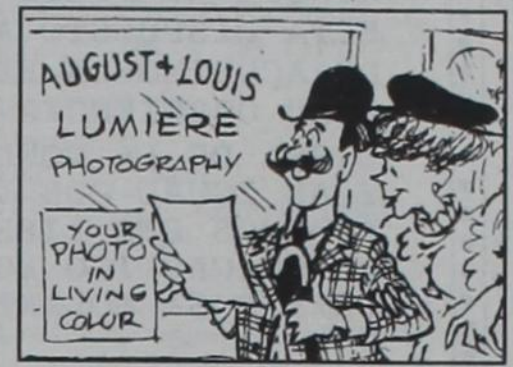

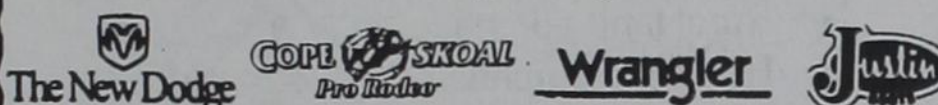
