# LINES from LINDA

**Tomatoes Like to be Caged**  
 West Texas in spring can be a hostile place for young tomato plants. Newly set plants suffer a severe setback, sometimes death, when exposed to wind and cold. However, there is a way to set out tomato plants in May and protect them until the wind calms down and the nights warm.  
 Enclosing tomatoes in plastic-wrapped cages gives them much needed protection during May. Caged plants will grow much

faster and produce more early

fruit and greater total yield than those with staking and pruning or ground culture systems.  
 Construct cages from concrete reinforcing wire, hog wire or any sturdy wire mesh fencing that is two-and-a-half to five feet tall with openings of four to six inches. Cut and bend the mesh material into cylinders about 18 inches in diameter. Fasten the ends together by bending the wire inward so that it will not scratch you as your work around

the plants. Wrap the full height of the cage in a sheet of clear plastic. Allow enough extra plastic to make a neat baker's fold which you will staple every four to six inches to tightly secure it around the cage wire.  
 Allow four to five feet between plants to give you plenty of room to work around your caged plants. Select tomato varieties well adapted to caging such as Spring Giant Hybrid, Big Set Hybrid, Small Fry Hybrid, Jack Pot Hybrid, or Sun Ripe Hybrid.  
 After transplanting the tomatoes and watering them in with a starter solution, place a cage over each plant with the plant centered inside the cage. Anchor the cage to a stout stake driven into the ground and tied to the cage with wire or string. This is about all there is to it.  
 As the days grow warmer and daytime temperatures rise into the 80's, slip the plastic wrap inward to allow cool air to enter the cage, thereby preventing excessively high temperatures around the plant. When the night temperatures stop going below 55 to 69 degrees, you can remove the plastic wrap entirely.  
 Cages will cost about 50 cents apiece and will last at least four to five years. The cage supports all fruits up off the ground and encourages the plant to grow upright so that the leaves shade the fruit and prevent sunburn. The plants are easier to spray and will have less problems with insect and disease control.  
 Caged plants are not pruned, but simply trained so that several stems grow to the top of the cage while others grow out through the openings at different heights.  
 Other vegetable adapted to caging include peppers, egg plant, cucumbers and pole beans.

## WHEELER PUBLIC LIBRARY BOOK REVIEW

"Storm On The Range," by Max Brand, is about the strange happenings of a single night that turned Tom Fernald, a poverty-stricken shepherd, into a feared gunfighter and a rancher of mysterious wealth. The money lender Pete Visconti would foreclose, now that Fernald could not make his mortgage payment. Then, only minutes after he had made his threat, he was killed by a bucking horse. Summoning up long concealed strength and nerve Fernald hid the dead body, and searched for and found the miser's vast treasure. But one person knew the secret that could destroy him. Would Fernald silence this enemy with persuasion - or a bullet?  
 In "To Love a Stranger," by Barbara Paul, Beth Stewart, a beautiful orphan whose books of wild flower illustration and have brought her a rare independence, embarks on her voyage to Fordendal, her mother's birthplace. It is a place of surpassing loveliness, but it is also a place of danger, for Fordendal does not welcome strangers and someone is willing to go to any lengths to force Beth to flee. Intellectually, art helps a child increase his attention span, learn to solve his own problems and then follow up with the solutions. Art also lets a child invent things and techniques, and it allows him to express himself visually through his creations.

 Do NOT say "That's very nice, but why didn't you make a 'so and so'?" Finally, do NOT tell a child, "We don't draw that sort of thing."  
 Adults who criticize in these ways retard a child's growth four ways - the same four ways in which he could have grown, if they had allowed the art experience to live.

### Size Standard Effective July 15

"Use up your small and undersized envelopes and cards before July 15," Area Postmasters reminds customers. That is the date when the Postal Service's new size standards become effective.

The postmaster's said that after July 15, envelopes and cards measuring less than 3 1/2 inches high or 5 inches long will be returned to the sender if mailed.

Postmasters said that because the envelope and greeting card industries have had more than three years to prepare for the new standards, few retailers should still be selling undersized pieces.

Many consumers, however, are likely to still have smaller envelopes and cards in their supply of stationery.

The regulations also prohibit flimsy cards. In the future they must be at least seven-thousandths (.007) of an inch thick. An official postal card, for instance, has a thickness of nine thousandths of an inch.

Undersized pieces and flimsy cards are being banned because they can become trapped in other mail, tear and jam mail processing machinery. As a result, the letters of others can also be damaged.

The standards also affect oversized and odd-shaped pieces of mail. For first-class mail weighing one ounce or less, there will be a surcharge of 7 cents for pieces more than 6 1/8 inches

high or 11 1/2 inches long. For more information, the postmaster suggests customers check with a post office in your area.

### Greenbelt Holds Annual Meeting

A director's election highlighted the annual meeting of Greenbelt Electric Cooperative held April 27 in Wellington as over 120 registered participants heard various important reports and enjoyed entertainment and attendance prizes.

Selba Rainey was re-elected as a Director from District 3, and Frank Murray was re-elected from District 7. A newly-elected Director is Horace Green from District 6, replacing A. J. Garland.

Garland, who has served the co-op as a Director for some 26 years, was given special commendation in comments by General Manager David Pruitt.

The annual report to members noted that operating revenue for 1978 was \$1,312,961, and total cost of providing service for the year was \$1,348,330.

General Manager David Pruitt, in his report, noted that inflation, coupled with expenses tied to ice storm damage, were primary reasons for the expense increase in 1978 as compared to 1977. Pruitt also announced that a rate increase would assist in offsetting the higher expenses incurred by the system in providing power.

"Inflation hits us hard just like it hits everyone," Pruitt said. "Through good management practices we keep rates as low as possible."

The annual report noted that 33 percent of all revenues collected by the system were paid out to offset fuel adjustment costs charged to the Co-Op for power. Another 12 percent went for power costs as part of the base power rate, for a total of 45 percent of revenues which were paid out directly for power supply.

Some 6 percent of revenues in 1978 were expensed for interest on debt, 3 percent went for taxes, 11 percent for depreciation and amortization, and 18 percent for office and administrative expense. There was a net operating loss of one percent for the year.

"We will maintain a sound financial condition in 1979 with the proposed rate increase," said Pruitt, "and the Co-Op will continue to be a reliable supplier of power to its members."

The Burks are proud grand parents of 16 grandchildren - five more by marriage and 4 great grandchildren.

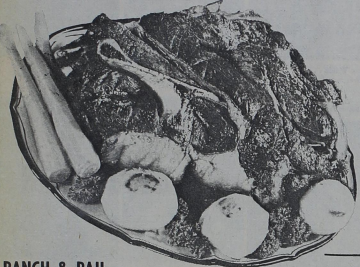
