After the death of Kleobis, he goes to Athens to the court of the Pisistratids under the patronage of Hipparchos, who gathers to him a glittering group of artists of all kinds. Simonides once again survives upheaval and finally retires to Sicily, where he looks back over his long and eventful life. In "The Maine Massacre," by Janwillem van de Wetering, an aging Commissaris comes to Maine to help settle his sister's affairs following the death of her husband. SPS Announces Sale Of TUCO




