### COTTON PRODUCTION

A Cotton Production Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 3 at 7:30 p.m. in the Shamrock High School auditorium. The meeting is sponsored by the Crops Committee of the Wheeler County Program Building Com-

mittee and the Texas Agricultural Extension Service with the cooperation of the Shamrock Co-Op Gin.

The meeting will feature presentation by Texas Agricultural Extension Service specialist on various practices that could increase cotton profits.

Dr. James Supak, Area Agronomist-Cotton, will give information on several cotton varieties that are suited to Wheeler County. He will also discuss a fertility program for both irrigated and dryland cotton. Dr. Supak has been the Area Agronomist at Lubbock since 1972.

Dr. Frank Petr, Area Agronomist, Amarillo, will discuss the use of herbicides for the control of weeds in cotton.

Mr. Leon New, Area Agricultural Engineer-Irrigation, Lubbock, will discuss the timing of water applications and the amount of water to apply to make the most efficient use of irrigation water, this is an increasingly important subject for those growing irrigated cotton.

This meeting is open, without charge to anyone interested in cotton production. Educational programs of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service serve people of all ages regardless of socioeconomic level, race, color, sex, religion or national origin.

### Mustangs Enter Lefors Track Meet

The Wheeler Mustangs track team finished 7th out of 16 teams. It was cold windy day, but the times for the Mustangs were very good. 440 Relay team made up of Authur Zepeda, Boyd Waldo, Bret Mosley and Benny Baker finished 6th with a time of 48.3. Kevin Andis finished 5th in the 880 yd. run with a good time of 2:15.7 considering the wind. Benny Baker and Arthur Zepeda both ran 10.8 in the 100 yd. dash, even though neither placed. Mike Gallagher placed 3rd in the 330 yd. Intermediate Hurdles with a personal best time of 43.7 and Tyle Henderson placed 4th in the mile run with a good time of 5:09.

Rich Brown and Bobby Jones also had good times, but did not place. Benny Baker placed 3rd in the long jump with a jump of 18'9 1/2" and Toby Bradstreet placed 5th in the pole vault by clearing a height of 10'. The Mustangs travel to Groom on Saturday, March 31, for the Groom Relays before returning home for the Wheeler Relays on April 7th. The district meet is scheduled for Thursday, April 12th in Miami.
