Individuals who have ordered trees, both windbreak and pecan, from the Wheeler County Soil and Water Conservation District are reminded that the trees will be delivered at the Wheeler County Showbarn about one mile north of hiways 83 and 152 intersection on Wheeler beginning at 9:00 a.m. till 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 21, 1985. The Wheeler County SWCD asks that everyone please be there on time to pick them up. You are reminded that the evergreens are containerized and will need no special preparations to haul them home, unless they are to be hauled in the backend of a pickup, in which case they should be covered if the trip is long. However, all other trees are barerooted and you should bring some protection, a small plastic tarp will do nicely, both for your vehicle and to prevent drying of the roots while enroute.

The late Glen Truax, a Shamrock High School bandmaster, gave the Irish fantasy life in 1938, when Shamrock Boosters Club latched onto his suggestion that a town with such a fine Irish name should capitalize on it with an annual St. Patrick's Day Celebration so grand it would attract thousands of visitors and worldwide attention.

Melvin McIntyre says he's already planted 100 lbs. of potatoes. We may just visit him.


