WHEELER PUBLIC LIBRARY **BOOK REVIEW**

In "Margaret, the Tragic Princess", James Brough explores the childhood of Princess Margaret, her reign as the star of the glittering whirl of post-war London, the private heartbreak of her two star-crossed romancesand uncovers the cruel secret that has transformed the beguiling little princess into a truly tragic princess-and an unexpectedly gallent woman. She was the impish charmer who captured the royal heart of a nation at war, the madcap princess who danced and flirted her way through the postwar years, the heartbroken young woman who renounced a dashing suitor out of royal duty, who struggled bravely in the shadow of her royal sister. Her family and the nation rejoiced when she found a loving and celebrated husband in Anthony Armstrong Jones, gave birth to a son and daughter, and settled into a life of unobtrusive domesticity. But no marriage, it seemed, could survive between the millstones of Margaret's royal duty and Tony's creative imperatives. The story book romance was broken beyond hope or desire of repair. With courage unrecognized by the press, Margaret has sought to fill her life once again with private personal pleasures. But the Princess's behavior, friends, and appearances have become a favorite subject of London's scandal sheets. Despite a stringent press barrier, her face often appears in the tablord's, puffy, tired and lonely, along with stories of her pursuit of expensive escape.
