## RABIES CLINIC IN WHEELER MAR. 25

Dr. Tommie Hennard will hold a Rabies Clinic Saturday, March 26. The purpose of the clinic will be to vaccinate all pets against rabies. At the same time the City of Wheeler will have dog licenses on sale.

The clinic will be held at the Wheeler Veterinary Clinic on West Highway 152 from 1:00 until 5:00. Pet owners are urged to have their pets on a leash to better control them.

The vaccination will protect the animal for a period of one year. The shot will cost \$4.00.

The licenses will cost \$1.00 for males and spayed females and \$2.00 for females.

For those people who have had their dogs vaccinated, but have not purchased a license, it will be necessary to take the animal and proof of vaccination to the clinic to obtain the dog license. All dogs in the City Limits are required to be licensed and vaccinated.

Area citizens are urged to bring their animals in at this time to be vaccinated against rabies.

For those owners who are unable to bring their pets to the clinic, call 826-5821 during the time the clinic is being conducted and a member of the Key Club will be on duty to pick up the animals.

**Cats Should Be Vaccinated**

Although it is not required that cats be vaccinated, they are in danger in the fight against rabies and should be vaccinated, stated Dr. Hennard. The cost for vaccinating a cat will be \$4.00.

## CITY COUNCIL

### BIDS ARE ACCEPTED FOR PURCHASE OF FIRE TRUCK

The regular meeting of the Wheeler City Council was held Monday evening, March 20, at the city office.

The council opened the bids for a pumper to be installed on a cab and chassis. The pumper will replace the "Red Firetruck" which has been in use for the past 28 years. Three bids were submitted. Fire Appliance submitted the low bid in the amount of \$24,596.94—F.O.B. Wichita Falls. The pumper will be completed 200 calendar days after delivery of the cab and chassis. Boardman of Oklahoma City and Seagraves of Austin also submitted bids.

Two bids were received for a cab and chassis for the pumper. The low bid in the amount of \$10,900.00 for the cab and chassis.

Following discussion, the council voted to accept the low bid on both pumper and cab and chassis. It will be close to a year before the completed fire truck is delivered.

Only one bid was submitted for the extension of the sewer line in the Vise Addition. The bid by Bowen Construction in the amount of \$5040 was accepted.

Jerry Hefley reported on activities in the Water and Sewer Department. Hefley ask that the council purchase a dump bed for the cab chassis purchased last month; the council will advertise for bids with bids to be opened at a special meeting Friday, March 31.

Richard Wallace reported on receipts and disbursements for the Month of February.

The City of Wheeler will serve as collecting agent in the paving, curb and gutter of Alan L. Bean Boulevard from 152 north to city limits. The council voted to adopt an ordinance assessment property owners for curb and gutter per actual cost of construction.

Bids on billing machine were opened and tabled.

Bill Owen reported on meeting attended in Amarillo and Plainview.

A resolution to appointed PRPC as Solid Waste Agency for this region was adopted.

The council voted a cost of living wage increase to the city employees.

The Library has paid-off their loan at the Bank. The money was borrowed by the city for the purchase of shelving. The council voted to pay the interest on the note.

Street Lights will be extended west on 152 to the city limits and one light will be located at the Library.

Applications for Swimming Pool Manager will be taken. The applications will be review at the April 15 council meeting.

The council voted to require developers to furnish water and sewer to development sights. The developer will also be responsible for a percent of curb, gutter and paving.

Bids will be taken for the keeping of the grounds at the park and city office for the summer.

Bills were reviewed and paid.

## Livestock Ass'n Equipment Sale

The Wheeler County Livestock Show Association will sponsor a farm equipment sale Saturday, April 15 at the Wheeler County Agricultural Center in Wheeler according to Don King, CEA. Proceeds from the sale will be used for improvements to the Agricultural Center and to pay expenses of the Wheeler County Junior Livestock Show.

The Association already has several pieces of equipment, including trucks, tractors and combines, tentatively consigned. This equipment is valued at \$5-\$60,000.

Other equipment is welcome in the sale. Anyone wishing to have equipment listed on the sale bill can call Don King at 826-5243 or 826-3249 in Wheeler no later than Monday, March 27. Consignments will be accepted after this date but will not appear on the sale bill.

The livestock Show Association will handle publicity and sale of the equipment. There will be a 5% commission charge and a 1% charge on equipment bought back by the consignor with a minimum commission or buy-back charge of \$2.50 per item. There will be a maximum buy-back charge of \$50 per item with \$150 per consignor.

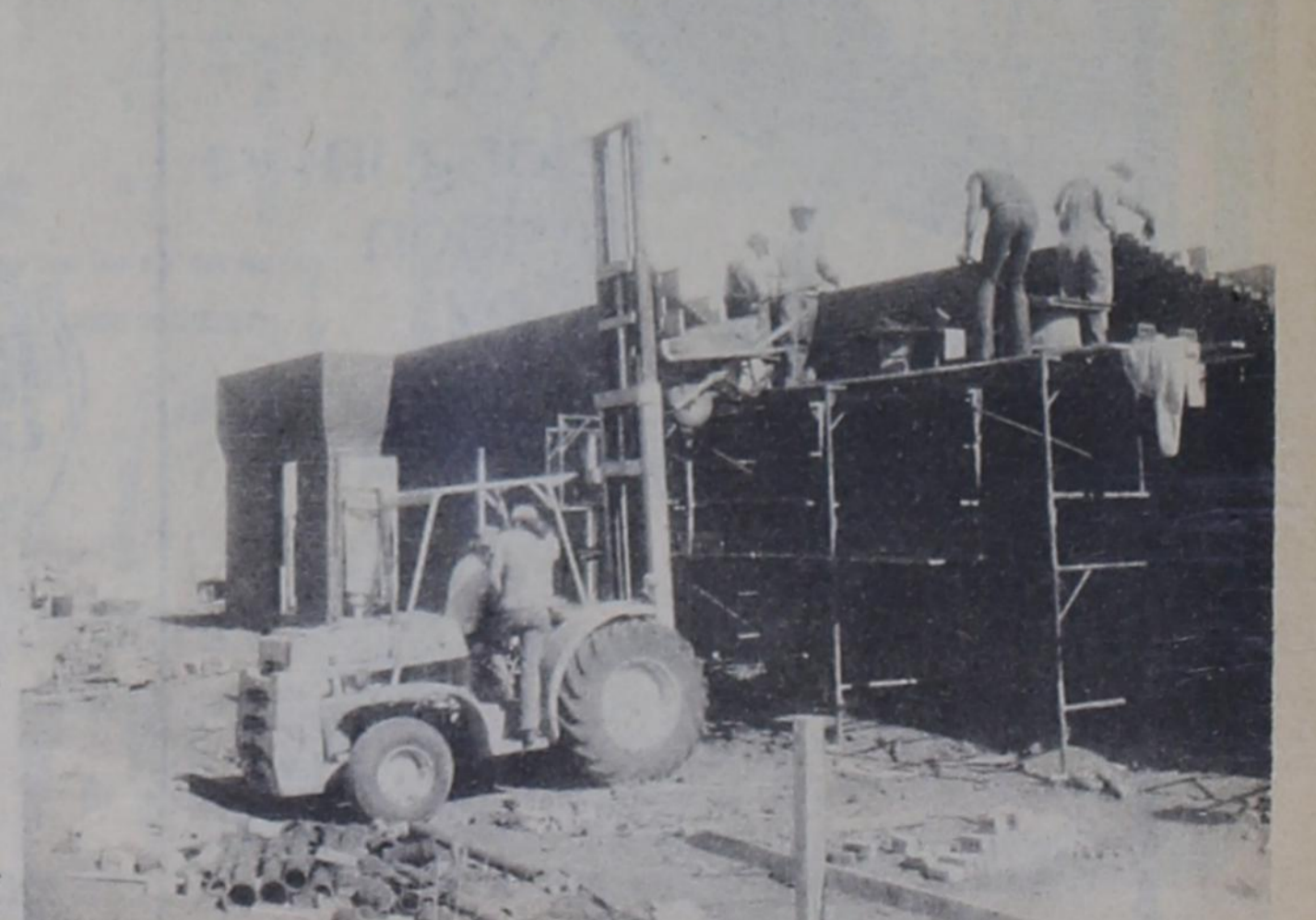
## Key Club Plans Work Day Mon.

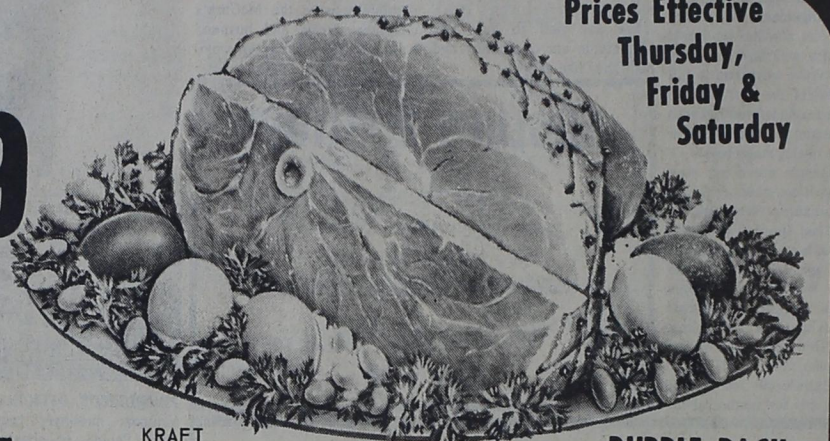
