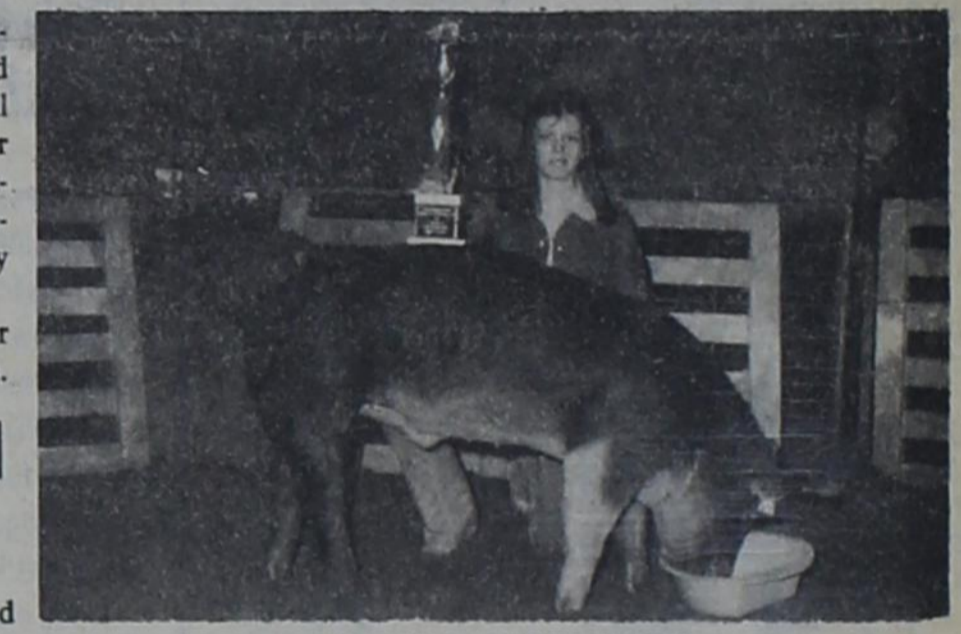

3 Plead Guilty In District Court

James Edward Campbell, 34 years old, Roy Lee Austin, 24, and Jessie W. Walker, 20 have pled guilty before District Judge Grainger McIlhany to a charge of burglarizing Drug in Shamrock on January 2, 1978. Campbell with one previous conviction received 10 years in the Texas Dept. of Corrections. Austin with two previous convictions received 20 years and Walker with two previous convictions received 20 years. The three subjects admitted in court that they entered the drug store with the intent to steal drugs and sell them in Amarillo. All three have been in the County Jail in Wheeler since the arrest in Shamrock on January 2, 1978. Campbell will be released to Brown County where he faces another burglary charge while Austin and Walker will be transported to Huntsville by the Wheeler County Sheriffs' Department.

Berl Sullivan, 26 of Chillicothe, Ohio on probation in Wheeler County for Unauthorized use of a Motor Vehicle and his probation reinstated after having been arrested and charged with violation of Probation by reason of failing to report and leaving the State without permission. Sullivan was arrested at Stamford in Jones County & returned to Wheeler County in February. The hearing was before Judge McIlhany on March 13.

Rabies Clinic To Be Sat., Mar. 25

Dr. Tommie Hennard will hold a Rabies Clinic Saturday, March 26. The purpose of the clinic will be to vaccinate all pets against rabies. At the same time the City of Wheeler will have dog licenses on sale.

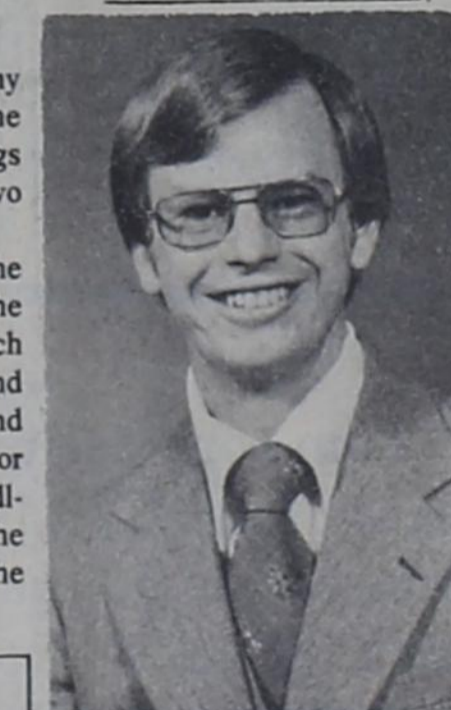
The clinic will be held at the Wheeler Veterinary Clinic on West Highway 152 from 1:00 until 5:00. Pet owners are urged to have their pets on a leash to better control them. The vaccination will protect the animal for a period of one year. The shot will cost \$4.00.

The licenses will cost \$1.00 for males and spayed females and \$2.00 for females. For those people who have had their dogs vaccinated, but have not purchased a license, it will be necessary to take the animal and proof of vaccination to the clinic to obtain the dog license. All dogs in the City Limits are required to be licensed and vaccinated.

Area citizens are urged to bring their animals in at this time to be vaccinated against rabies.

For those owners who are unable to bring their pets to the clinic, call 826-5821 during the time the clinic is being conducted and a member of the Key Club will be on duty to pick up the animals.

Cats Should Be Vaccinated
Although it is not required that cats be vaccinated, they are in danger in the fight against rabies and should be vaccinated, stated Dr. Hennard. The cost for vaccinating a cat will be \$4.00.

**Book Reviewed
At Club Meeting**

Anna Green was hostess to the Progressive Study Club the evening of March 2, Texas Independence Day, for a program on Texas Heritage.

The President, Novella Vanpool, called the meeting to order and welcomed the guests. The group then read the Club Collect in unison.

Roll call was answered with "An interesting Place I have Visited in Texas."

Following a brief business session Curtis Moore introduced Esther Sorensen, the guest speaker for the evening.

Miss Sorensen first gave some interesting remarks about her parents who came from Denmark to our country and settled at Gainsville, Texas where they lived several years. Later they settled at Yukon, Oklahoma after her father made the Oklahoma Land Run on mule back and secured land there. In 1906 the family moved back to Texas when Esther was a small girl and settled on land north of Wheeler which we know as the Sorensen ranch. Esther loves the old home place and moved into town only a few years ago.

Miss Sorensen then gave highlights from the book "Pioneer Days in the South West" by Emanuel Dubbs who moved to Wheeler County in 1878 and was elected its first Judge the following year. Mr. Dubbs settled on land adjacent to the Sorensen place.

Events of the book took place during the period of 1850 to 1879.

Miss Sorensen related some which gave us an idea of the early days. Those of much interest include: How law was conducted in the early day. For instance Mr. Dubbs wrote that a group of citizens got together when he wasn't present and elected him Judge. How he made money by hunting wild game and selling it to Ft. Elliot. How he observed the cruelty of the Indians when he found a mutilated body. The Indians strange actions at the time of death and burial of one of their tribe. The fierce action of an charging buffalo. The hughness of the Goodnight ranch which had at one time 100,000 head of cattle. The gambling house in Mobeetie. The crude ways of making candles, washing clothes, etc. in pioneer days of our area. Pauline Hefley concluded the program with a short but witty talk about "Cowboys, Yellow Roses and a Lone Star".
