A lack of water and little food are two of the many factors which lead thousands of sandhill cranes into new or little-used areas near Andrews, Abilene and San Angelo this winter.

This influx of cranes allowed would be duck and goose hunters to participate in the three month season which ended January 31, but caused avid crane hunters to search for birds in the traditional areas of Lynn and Terry counties south of Lubbock.


A state-issued crane permit was required of each crane huster prior to hunting the bird and the Austin P&WD office issued 4,929, down from last years record 5,060.

All crane hunters issued a permit will be receiving a questionaire asking for more important aspects of the hunt including days hunted, birds bagged and/ or lost, and location of hunt.

As crane hunting becomes more popular, it is estimated that more waterfowl hunters will participate in the hunt next fall.


