today. Pieratt aurthorized the
Mr. loans following a request from
Wendell Morgan, County Judge, Wendell Morgan, County Judge,
Wheeler County, Texas. The request for emergency
assistance from the Farmers assistance from the Farmers
Home Administration came as a Home Administration came as a
result of losses sustained by local farmers hit by the tornado and
high winds on May 16, 1977. The high winds on May 16, 1977. The
disaster did not affect a large number of farms, but those who
were stricken have suffered se-
vere losses.
Farmers can apply for assis tance at the FHHA County office
at Wheeler until October 3, 1978 at Wheeler until October 3, 1978
for preduction losses and March 3, 1978 for plysical losses. To be eligible for a loan, an applicant
must have suffered losses from the disaster and be unable to get
credit from other sources. credit from other sources.
Loans covering actual losses are made at an interest rate of
five percent and are scheduled for repayment as rapidly
feasible consistent with the ap feasible consistent with the
plicant's reasonable ability. Loans beyond actual losses can
be repaid in various periods,
depending upon the purpose of depending upon the purpose of
the loan. The interest rate for short-term loans for farm opera
ing purposes is 3 percent. Long-term loans are bei made at an interest rate of 5
percent. Emergency loan funds may be
used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer livestock, or to meet interest and
depreciation payments on current real estate and chattel debts. A farmer can use the money for
essential operating and living essential operating and living
costs, Mr. Pieratt said.
Emergency loans can be used
to help the farmer restore damaged farm operations and ad ditional loans based upon the
emergency designation can be used to make major adjustment

ivity.

## There are three primary reasons for offering this program for your approval at this time.

- First, the need exists and is steadily growing. The need definitely is not going to diminish in the future for either the physical education classes, for the storm sheter or for the addiond chassoom
- Spacend, although construction costs are high at this time they can only be expected to grow in the
- Third, the increases in assessed valuation occasioned by the tremendous growth in values of oil and gas properties in the district enable us to finance the cost of these improvements with no increase in
cost to the local resident taxpayer. In fact, the total tax rate has been lowered for the past three years due to the increased values of mineral interests, and in the future the tax rate to support the new debt will remain the same as that now levied.
