




The Wheeler County 4-H Junior Rodeo scheduled for August 12-13, is shaping up. The rodeo will be in the Wheeler Riding Club Arena with the performances starting at 8:00 P.M. each night.

Hanner said the rodeo is being sponsored by the Wheeler County 4-H Council and the 4-H Texans Horse Club. Proceeds from the rodeo will go to support the club's programs during the coming year.
