LIBRARY RECEIVES A \$2,500 CHECK

The Wheeler Library Board received a check Friday, July 9, 1977 from the M. K. Brown Foundation, Inc. of Pampa for \$2,500. The check was payable to the City of Wheeler (as the Wheeler Public Library is officially considered a part of the City of Wheeler) to be used as a donation for the library.

Bill W. Waters, chairman of the Board of Trustees, had been corresponding with Anita Brown, Secretary-Treasurer of the Wheeler Library Board, since last October checking the tax exemption status of the library, etc. Donations are made only to tax exempt entities.

The M. K. Brown Foundation, Inc. supports Gray County organizations, programs for the elderly, medical research, youth programs, church support (Episcopal and Baptist) and various educational projects. The Wheeler Public Library is proud to be added to this list.

County Sheriff's Report

Sheriff Doyle Ramsey reports 16 prisoners handled through the County Jail during the Month of June. This brings the total for 1977 to 137.

Of those held during June seven were held on the charge of D.W.I., two for public intoxication, two for fighting, one on theft charge, one on the charge of burglary, and two on traffic offenses. One juvenile runaway was held after being picked up by D.P.S. officers and released to his mother.

Sheriff Ramsey reports that the Texas Commission on Jail Standards inspected the Wheeler County Jail and the lock-up in Shamrock on June 22. Inspector Joseph C. Slater of Sweetwater was the inspector. According to inspector Slater the Commission would reply on the inspection in about six weeks.

Sheriff Ramsey also reports the appointment of a new Deputy Sheriff in Shamrock. Deputy David Johnson assumed duties on June 27. David was raised in the Lela area and attended Shamrock High School where he is a graduate.

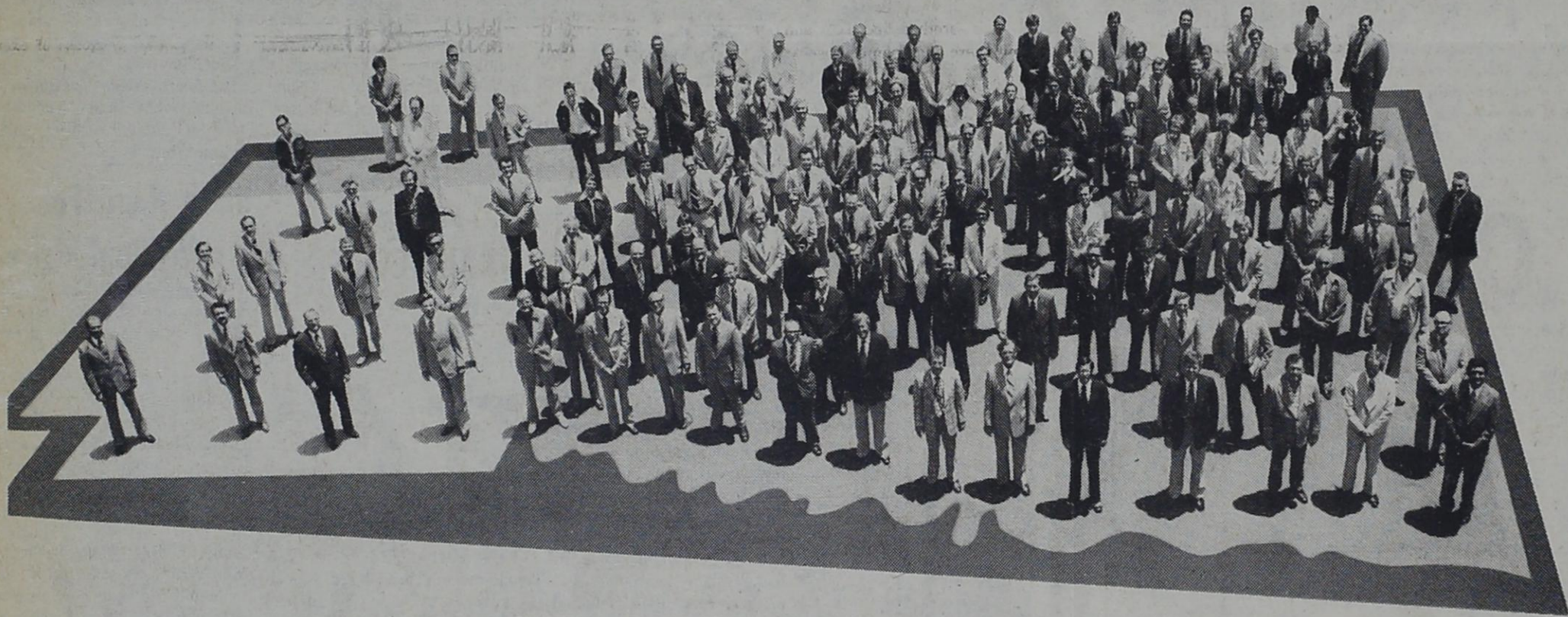

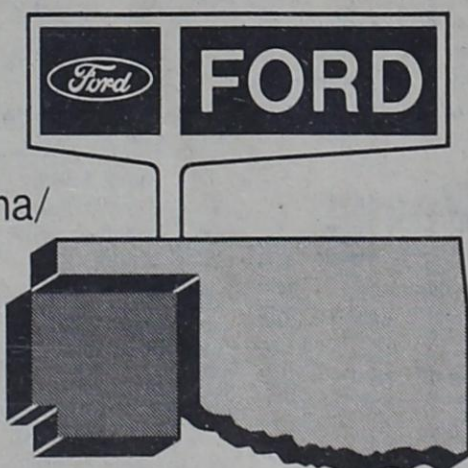

KING'S KOMMENTS

By JOE DON KING, County Agent

BAG WORMS ON ORNAMENTAL

There are currently heavy infestations of bagworms on many ornamental trees and shrubs in Wheeler County. The bagworm larva grows to 1 to 1½ inches and is dark brown to black with a lighter head. It builds a tough spindle shaped bag covered with leaf material.

Heavy infestation can quickly defoliate trees, especially cedar. The bagworm can be controlled with Sevin but the plant must be sprayed when the bagworm is feeding. After the insect goes into the bag and seals it off to pupate, spraying is not effected.

Bags should be removed from the plant and burned.
