There are currently heavby infestations of bagworms on many ornamental trees and KOUNTY FRESH shrubs in Wheeler County. The inches and is dark brown to black with a lighter head. It builds a tough spindle shaped bag covered with leaf material.

Heavy infestation can quickly defoliate trees, especially cedar. The bagworm can be controlled with Sevin but the plant must be sprayed when the bagworm is feeding. After the insect goes into the bag and seals it off to pupate, spraying is not


