


TOTALLY DESTROYED: Nora's Steakhouse located on west highway 152 in Wheeler was a total loss as a result of an early morning fire Saturday. The clock in the restaurant stopped at 4:55. Owner of the restaurant, Odessa Mooney, could not give an estimate of the loss. From appearances, someone broke into the cafe, entering through a rear window; they raided the kitchen and cleaned the freezers. The fire was started in the storage room of the building. In their haste to leave, the intruders left a package of 16 oz. T-bone steaks on a table at the back door. The state fire marshal has been called in to investigate.
