Diseases associated with agin Seniors may get needed nutrifour food groups--which are milk, meat, fruits and vegeta ables, breads and cereals. They need two servings from the milk group, including fluid milk as a beverage, cream
soups, custards, cottage cheese soups, cust. The meat group includes al eggs, dry beans and peas. Older adults should try to eat at least two servings of meat or meat alternates each day. The fruits and vegetab es group add color, flavor and texture as well as nutrients and bulk. each day, including one citrus fruit and one dark green leafy or deep yellow vegetable. And finally, seniors should try to eat four servings of enriched breads and cereals. Remember, also to include water with the fluids you drink every day, ei ther
